Crazy Hope Community Center - Update

Things are about to get busy at Crazy Hope!

Our architect and engineers have been hard at work approving the center's structure, and they have given approval and guidance for Phase 1 of renovations to begin. And since Community Connections Darlington has been




blessed with community donations and fruitful fundraisers, this means we are about to RAISE THE ROOF at the Crazy Hope Community Center! The leadership team is currently talking to roofers and reviewing estimates to replace the community center's roof. Look for construction to take place in the very near future!

Once the roof is in place and cooler temperatures prevail, the last bit of interior demolition will take place to what was formerly the apartment area of the structure. In the mean time, we continue to raise and seek funding for the remainder of the needed renovations. It is our hope that once the main interior space and bathrooms have been completed we can move the Saturday Soup Kitchen to the community center. Although the kitchen will still not be completed at that time, we believe that we can better serve our community by having a place of our own to serve from and a place where we can spend time building relationships with those we serve.

As a reminder, Crazy Hope renovations will take place in four separate phases.

- Phase 1 : Remaining Roof & Structural Supports In Progress
- Phase 2 : Main Interior Space, Conference Room, Office, & Bathrooms
- Phase 3 : Bathhouse and Storage
- Phase 4 : Kitchen



Soup Kitchen Spotlight

- We now have 21 different groups serving in the weekly rotation. 16 of these groups come from various churches, and five of these groups come from other organizations in our community.
- Since January 1st, we have had community friends join together twice to fill in the gap by providing and serving a meal when one of our partners was unable to serve.
- We have had hundreds of volunteers since January 1, 2023.


