- Support a televet call line for after hours--ACCOMPLISHED




Veterinary Support and Recruitment

- ► Volunteers cover every clinic in Las Cruces and a few beyond. On a quarterly basis, we check to make sure we have the most up-to-date job and externship opportunities posted on our website.
- ▶ In 2023, we traveled to the national conference of the American Veterinary Medical Association in Denver, to Iowa State University, and to Florida State University-Gainesville to speak with and recruit veterinarians and veterinary students.
- ➤ On a monthly basis, we upload images and a 400 word news page to our Veterinary School Partnership Practices at ISU, FSU, and Texas A&M, highlighting our area and opportunities for externships and employment.
- ➤ We have joined Handshake, a digital platform used by many universities in order to upload career and externship opportunities to college students across the country.



Education

- We completed six 2-4 minute videos with NMCO Creative Studio and Dr. Sarah Walley, which are now on our YouTube Channel or viewable from our website. This fulfills a wish of our clinics and shelter. The videos cover "Infectious Diseases & Vaccines," "Spay/Neuter," "Snake Envenomation," "Obesity," "Marijuana/Cannabis," and "Heartworm."
- We have provided information at numerous community events, including a special collaboration with the Mayor of Mesilla and Zia Mobile Clinic for registration, vaccination, and education.

- ► Working with Representative Joanne Ferrary, Dr. Dawn Duncan, our founder and chair, prepared a bill to remove non-compete clauses from veterinary professionals. Dawn spoke before the committee where it passed unanimously. The bill comes before the legislature in the early 2024 session.
- ► Another issue about which Dawn spoke in committee is the need to accept out-of-state veterinary licenses so veterinary professionals moving here can practice right away, also an incentive for them to come. A bill expediting such licensure was passed in the 2023 session. SUCCESS!

Our Pet Stories



- ► Our revenue for the year, from grants, donations & fundraising = \$90,118.21
- ► Our expenses, greater this year as we ramped up our recruiting = \$25,592.17
- ▶ Only 5% of expenses went to administrative fees, the rest entirely programmatic, thanks to a fully volunteer Board
- ► Our current balance = \$132,796.06

Looking Ahead: Our 2024 Board


