## PARTICIPATION BY ELECTED OFFICIALS

Effective January 1, 1997 a constitutional limited participation in public amendment retirement plans by elected officials in Louisiana. In the case of Parochial, newly elected Parish presidents and justices of the peace are still eligible to join the system within one year of taking their oath of office. Coroners may enter the system at any time. Police jurors, school board members and constables may no longer join Parochial. However, those elected officials in office and participating in Parochial on January 1, 1997 may continue participation as long as they hold office. For those who held elected office in January 1997, and held membership on that date, and subsequently left office, there may be a basis for membership if they are re-elected. Should you encounter anyone falling into this last group, please call our office so that we can discuss the circumstances with you.

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#### BOARD MEMBER ELECTION

Early next month ballots will be mailed to each participating employer in connection with an election of a trustee from the Jefferson, St. Bernard and Plaquemines area. Candidates for this position include the incumbent, Ms. Terrie Rodrigue and Ms. Sheryl Lambert. The term of office is six years beginning on January 1, 2005 and running through December 31, 2010 and all active members of Parochial are eligible to vote. Ballots will be due in our office by the close of business on November 30, 2004.

#### NOTICE OF LEAVE DATES IS NEEDED

When employees are on leave without pay, such as with work-related injuries, it is important to notify our office of the date the absence began and the date the employee returned to work. Service credit is not earned for these periods of employment without salary so your help in notifying our office of the dates of absence is important.

#### NEW FEDERAL LAW STEMS FROM SOCIAL SECURITY OFFSETS

Federal legislation passed earlier this year will require that each Plan A employee hired on and after January 1, 2005 be made aware of the fact that Social Security taxes will not be withheld from their pay. Further, they must be made aware that retirement benefits based on employment for which Social Security taxes have not been paid can result in offsets to any Social Security benefits to which they may be entitled. These new hires will have to make this acknowledgement in writing

Draft wording for the required notice is being crafted in Washington now and we will forward a sample when it is available along with a reminder of the effective date.

Please note that Plan B employees are not affected by this new federal law as they <u>do</u> make Social Security contributions on their salary.

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#### <u>IMPORTANT STUFF!</u>

**WEBSITE:** Earlier this year the Parochial website was made available. Although it is not an interactive site, it is an excellent source of information. Our Summary of Principal Features booklet, many of our forms, recent newsletters and answers to frequently asked questions are all found on the site. We hope that you will find it useful and we welcome your comments.

**QUARTERLY REPORT FORMS MAILED:** Our office recently sent out quarterly contribution report forms in connection with third quarter contributions which are due by October 15th. Please keep this deadline in mind as you prepare the report.

**SUMMARY OF PRINCIPAL FEATURES:** By early November we will have distributed an updated version of our "Summary of Principal Features" booklet to each participating employer. These booklets are helpful guides to our retirement system and they should in turn be distributed to all active, full-time

**ELECTION DAY, NOVEMBER 2ND:** Important elections will be held November 2. Not only will a President be elected, but several of Louisiana's Congressional seats and local election runoffs will be decided. We hope you will urge your co-workers and employees to cast their vote.

MANAGING A DEFINED BENEFIT PLAN: Managing a defined benefit plan in the current environment requires that both assets and liabilities of the plan be scrutinized. Consequently, we feel that we must get a better understanding of how sick and annual leave is accrued at each employer. Later this fall our office will request a description of your leave accrual policy and accrued leave for each employee as of a recent date. Preparation for this request for data would be timely.

**CONTRIBUTION RATE CHANGES EFFECTIVE JANUARY 2005:** Effective January 1, 2005 Plan A employer contribution rates will rise from 11.75% to 12.75% and Plan B employer rates will rise from 5.25% to 5.75%. Employee contribution rates will remain at 9.50% for Plan A and at 3.00% for
