<u>Looking for original factory information on your classic?</u> There is a couple of sources I've used. If you have a GM vehicle, the GM Heritage Center offers scanned copies of Owner's manuals, spec sheets & advertising ads on many of their vehicles. Information Is downloadable in PDF for, and, it's free! https://www.gm.com/heritage/archive/vehicle-information-kits

For non-GM brands, the Automotive History Preservation Society (formally Wild About Cars) offers information on many brands. It is not free and requires a \$35 annual fee, but you can view what is available before you subscribe, you just can view the actual documents. I've downloaded original Assembly Manuals for my Oldsmobile thru this website, it holds a lot of information. https://autohistorypreservationsociety.org/document-library/
