- 1. EMS/Ambulance/SSV: Vicki Pinette / Gabe Cruz AMR
  - a. Chief Bartee: Roseville, Chief Dolson representing Placer Chiefs to coordinate meetings w/EMS folks
    - i. In process of filling Division Chief w/in next 2 weeks & Battalion Chief onboarded in June
    - ii. Roseville willing to coordinate EMS working w/SSV & AMR, but open to staff from other depts. joining committee
    - iii. Chief Duerr volunteered new employee as EMS rep
    - iv. Vicki at CAL Chiefs meeting currently
  - b. Jeff Mc Manus: EMS system stabilized
    - i. Issues w/Covid challenge reduced
      - ii. Tracking daily
  - c. Ambulance patient diversions reduced greatly over last month
    - i. Previously had significant issues w/multiple facilities going on diversions due to Covid challenges
    - ii. Sac Co. extended suspension of Ambulance Patient Diversion Policy through the 31<sup>st</sup>

- 2. OAC: Chief Spencer / OES Chief Zander
  - a. Chief Zander: Working towards an in-person Strike Team Refresher this year
    - i. Can be offered virtually as well if needed
    - ii. Up to discretion of Operating Coordinator's & County Chiefs
    - iii. Dates TBD
    - iv. Intended for all overhead that goes out/anyone leaving county under CFAA agreement
    - v. Run scenarios w/personnel
    - vi. Last refresher was online, prefer in person this year
    - vii. Chief Hudson to coordinate dates at Ops Meeting next week
  - b. OES vehicles available when needed
    - i. Keep status updated to fill requests
    - ii. "Live 405" is the direction OES is working towards
  - Local Government Dispatch employees assisting dispatch centers w/pre-season training
    i. Getting creative w/how to fund Comm Ops to assist w/mutual aid
  - d. Chief Bartee: ran into issue last year w/staffing discrepancy of 7-day vs. 14-day deployment
    - i. CFAA states 7 days, but we went to 14-day for ease of coordination efforts
    - ii. Culture & FFs are changing from years past & not as eager to commit to longer deployments
    - iii. Chief Bartee: How to handle deployments when personnel want to be swapped out prior to others when on Rainbow Team?
      - 1. Smaller Agency Ops Areas struggle due to lack of template/plan re: rotation schedule
    - iv. Chief Bartee: What is agency cost to swap out personnel if you choose to swap at 7 days, etc.
      - 1. Incident should be reimbursing for anything after 7 days, prior to would be agency responsibility
    - Chief Hudson: issues need to be addressed statewide re: ST only working 7 days, including 1 travel day in/1 travel day out and ST becoming upset if put on 12's to maximize on availability
    - vi. Chief Bartee: back to Ops to have discussion re: resolving the issue
    - vii. Chief Hudson: issues are more re: coordination of swap outs amongst agencies
    - viii. Chief Gow: Swap outs are a full-time job for the operational area coordinator during the active season, 7 vs 14-days is a significant impact on Ops
    - ix. Chief Spencer: distributed memo of expectations to avoid last minute items in preparation of being dispatched
      - 1. Remind folks to update googledocs timely
      - 2. Due to staffing issues last year, personnel get confused re: availability
      - 3. Recommend utilizing "What's App" to keep communication current w/ST Leaders
    - x. Chief Williams: proposed a presentation for Engine Bosses to train from
    - xi. Chief Estes: Stressed importance of Continuity of Operations
      - 1. Expectation should start at Chief level

- 2. Suggests that we agree on 14-day vs. 7-day in our County for many reasons (reduces admin strain, increased C.O.O., faster reset timelines, & supports the mission)
- xii. Chief Spencer: requested that communication be prompt if decision is to deviate from 14 day
- xiii. Chief Estes: CAL FIRE doesn't commit to fires w/out an end in sight
  - 1. Try to determine good investment/utilization of resources
  - 2. May have ability in the County to utilize resources under ABH & have flexibility to provide rotations w/in 7-day window if needed
- xiv. Chief Bartee: will have Ops come out w/plan for PCo. prior to May
  - 1. Once committed, Roseville won't shut down ST for crew leaving, personnel will have replacements on board or won't commit
- 3. <u>Operation/Training: Chief Hudson / Chief Nelson</u>
  - a. Chief Hudson: Will meet next week, met on 2/1
  - b. Recap: post incident analysis
    - i. Chemical suicide that Roseville assisted with
    - ii. Unified Command w/PCSO Sherrif/Kevin Griffiths
    - iii. Chief Lochner put out info re: chemical suicides as an AAR
    - iv. Recap by PCSO Kevin Griffiths
    - v. Much quicker response than anticipated
  - c. Placer Hills structure fire
    - i. Communication/accountability
    - ii. Discussion was re: Alternate Tacs w/in the County
    - iii. Asking Ops Chiefs to reaffirm secondary Tacs
    - iv. Discussion/confirmation re: all being w/in Bendix King M150s
    - v. Working to create consistency in alternate Tac Nets
    - vi. Need to clarify that the identified alternate Tac is utilized moving forward
  - d. SOGs
    - i. Evaluating needs
    - ii. Chief Rogers is defacto secretary & keeper of the SOG binder
    - iii. Nothing currently due for review
    - iv. Reviewing as a group for changes, updates, etc.
    - v. No plans for future development of SOGs unless requested
    - vi. Will be distributing 4 created last year w/final signatures to Chief Officers
  - e. Mutual Aid Agreement
    - i. Awaiting feedback for edits or additions
  - f. Discussions re: Regional IMT & position being taken by CAL FIRE NEU & AEU
    - i. Interested in involving LG Cooperators under the signatory authority of each Unit Chief
    - ii. Looking for support for the Team, bolster #s & provide opportunities to participate in more of an IMT role
    - iii. Regional IMT call this a.m.
    - iv. MOU is going through final legal phases
    - v. Once finalized will come to Chief Estes & Blankenheim for signatures
    - vi. Will strengthen county to have participation from all agencies
    - vii. Don't have to be currently qualified, gain Statewide experience in multiple scopes
  - g. Training: Rocklin to host 1<sup>st</sup> quarter training at acquired structure
    - i. Multicompany drill completing FireTac, FF survival/mayday & CO component of commanding the mayday
      - 1. Likely to happen after 1<sup>st</sup> quarter
      - 2. CAL FIRE/PCFD will host 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter Wildland Command & Control Meeting in late May/June
    - ii. PGE Training
      - 1. Working on pipeline & will have continuous burning off of gas

- 2. Starting 1<sup>st</sup> week of March
- 3. Chief Lauchner is working w/PGE to set up the drill they requested last meeting
- 4. Looking for a quarterly meeting so other agencies can get involved
- 5. PGE to bring equipment to location
- 6. CAL FIRE can accommodate Metro Fire units at quarterly training
- iii. Bartee: more position specific training needs to be focused on by IMT
  - 1. S420 opportunity coming up
  - 2. Hudson: Looking at 0305 classes
    - a. received Team invite to Max Drill in Redding at GAC
    - b. Allows people to try various positions & choose a track
    - c. Discussing the opportunities for UASI funded training
  - 3. Bartee: Training funds possibly available to use
  - 4. Atkinson: Agreed, have 300 class coming up w/open slots
  - 5. Hudson: Any position welcome, when we go to a jurisdiction, Operations fall to that Jurisdiction. Can move people in as Divisions, LOGS, Plans, Finance, Liaison Officers, Safety Officers, Command Staff especially w/Jurisdictional authority
    - a. Depending on person's rank is where they're going to be brought in at equivalent learning level
    - b. Will be awarded training opportunity & experience based on their rank & exposure on the incident
- 4. Fire Prevention/Investigations: Chief Rizzi: not in attendance
  - a. Woessner possibly assist w/Fire Prevention
  - b. FPO meeting recently
  - c. Further discussion when group meets again
- 5. <u>Sierra College Advisory: Jason Hemler: not in attendance</u>
  - a. Chief Bartee: trying to work deal w/Sierra College to get stationary vent prop determined
  - b. Chief Williams: Rocklin went to agreement w/Sierra College to do EMT ride-alongs in January
  - c. Chief Bartee: Roseville is ready to start ride-alongs again
- 6. <u>Communications/CAD: Chief Diemer:</u>
  - a. Will be discussing TAC channels in coming weeks, but haven't met recently
  - b. Demo in CAD to CAD
  - c. Chief Williams: Intro to Central Square
    - i. Has Hub to tie CADs together, giving ability to view, & request response
    - ii. Allows for Geofencing
    - iii. Instead of 5 agencies dispatching, it gives ability to see available resources, status, Agency geolocation abilities
    - iv. Spencer: What is the cost agreement?
    - v. You pay a cost to your CAD to implement & a cost to Central Square
    - vi. Chief Diemer: In terms of PCSO dispatch, would need to meet w/PCo. To discuss implementation of a shared agreement (use vs. cost)
    - vii. PCSOs CAD is owned by Central Square, would equal no cost to PCSO to implement
    - viii. Sheriff Griffiths: would be helpful on major event to have ability to see where everyone is in order to dispatch more efficiently
    - ix. Can OES assist w/cost?
    - x. Doesn't require specific hardware for CADS, but is required for vehicles
    - xi. Integrations have been done w/all CAD vendors in meeting except Rocklin & Lincoln

- xii. Chief Bartee: Working towards coordinating automatic aid dispatch
- xiii. Have to get CAD set up: \$35 startup fee per CAD & annual subscription of approx. \$15,000

  - a. Working on After Action Report & Recovery work on winter storm
  - b. Waiting for determination from governor's office re: CA Disaster Assistance Act Funding to aid w/clean-up

    - i. No cost
      - ii. Hosting for CSTI
    - iii. Target audience: mixed preferable
    - iv. PCo roster, county employees but anyone can attend

    - ii. Will be charging a fee of \$253 for every lift assist call (used OES rate based on  $\frac{1}{2}$  hour on a fee schedule to allow for adjustments)
    - iii. Contacted by CALA
    - iv. Lobbyists association concerned w/ordinance & charges
    - v. Gave presentation to explain
    - vi. Not a lot of pushbacks
    - vii. Specific to non-injury lift assists only
