Southern Bell Telephone and Telegraph Company's new Micro-wave link between Jacksonville and Thomasville was outlined briefly by Mr. Stanly Warth. He explained that this link completed a 3000 message circuit between Jacksonville, Florida and Mobile, Alabama. Mr. E. J. O'Connor discussed some of the problems involved in underground distribution of power within new residential subdivisions. A very interesting film entitled "Rescue Breathing" was presented by Mr. Stanley Warth. The film outlined the method of administering insufflation.

The group was invited by Mr. Ralph Oswald to hold its next meeting in Leesburg, Florida. This invitation was accepted, and the next meeting will be held there on August 12, 1960.

The meeting was then adjourned, and the group enjoyed a delicious lunch as guests of the Southern Bell Telephone & Telegraph Company and the American Telephone and Telegraph Company.
