The reading of the minutes of the previous meeting was dispensed with and approved as mailed.

State Accommodations Guide Sub Committee report was given by Verne Brown.

Brad Shepherd filled us in on the safety set back requirements. After quite a discussion Brad made a motion that the chairman write a letter to the State Highway Engineer acknowledging set back position stated by State Road Department pointing out conflicting position stated by B. P. R. requesting State Road Department to put in writing the position that the B. P. R. has adopted of refusing authorization on Federal Aid Projects unless utility locations conform to "Latest Safety Criteria." Also requesting State Road Department to obtain a written definition of "Latest Safety Criteria" from B. B. R. to pass on to F. U. C. C. Bob Traxler second motion and it so carried.

The chairman ask everyone present to write up specific case historys of the problems they have had with the new set back policy and send them to him so that they may be used by the various committees when discussing this with the State Road Department and B. P. R.

Mr. Ernest Salley brought us up to date on the many retirements and replacements in the local B. P. R. office and in the State Road Department. Ernest also gave us a brief history of the set back statement. He reminded us that the department officials had forewarn the utilities as early as June, 1967, but it took almost a year for us to see what was going to happen.

Arbitration sub committee, G. Reed reported that the State Road Department had requested a few changes be made in the proceedure we had outlined and moved that the changes be made. Motion was second by Brad shepherd and so carried.

The proceedure now reads as follows:

- 1. Should a dispute arise in any State Road Department District relative to the issuance of a utility permit, either or both utilities may request the Chairman of the Florida Utilities Coordinating Committee, by letter, with copies to the concerned utilities to form an advisory committee to review the case and arbitrate and conditions in contention; making a written report of their findings along with recommendations to the State Chairman of the Florida Utilities Coordinating Committee and the District Engineer of the State Road Department.
- 2. The chairman of the Florida Utilities Coordinating Committee will, when he receives a request for an Advisory Committee, appoint three (3) members from the State Committee who are located within the concerned district to such committee. One member will be appointed Advisory Committee Chairman by the State Chairman.
- 3. The advisory Committee Chairman will notify the concerned utilities by letter of the formation of such committee and state a time and place for the parties to meet. Copies of these letters will be sent to the District Engineer and the Chairman of the Florida Utilities Coordinating Committee.
- 4. Prompt and efficient service for the good of the public will be of paramount concern to the Advisory Committee. The Accommodation Guide lines as adopted by the State Road Department and the guide lines for the issuance of the utility permits will be of major concern in the arbitration of a dispute; along with such basic considerations as:
 - a. Each utility should be the judge of the quality and requirements of its own service.
 - b. That the best engineering solution of a specific problem has been determined.
 - c. That specific methods should be such as to meet the service requirements of either system in the most convenient and economical manner.
 - d. In determining what specific methods are most convenient and economical in any situation all facotrs for all facilities concerned would be taken into consideration, including present factors and those which can be reasonably foreseen.;
- Under no circumstances will a committee be formed or once formed ever consider any factors relative, either directly or indirectly, to territorial lines of the concerned utilities.
- 6. The Advisory Committee will assist the concerned utilities, arbitrate their differences and make recommendations in letter form to the State Road Dept. District Engineer with copies to the utilities and the Florida Utility Coordinating Committee Chairman.

House Moving Sub Committee, Marion Gilliam reported on the latest happenings of that committee.

Chairman Tinsley being concerned about no Sub Structure Committee in the Broward County area appointed Mr. Ed Bonacci, Post Office Box 1181, City of Fort Lauderdale as temporary chairman so that an organization of this type can get off the floor.

General Telephone requested that we look into the possibilities of Random Lay. Lets find out what problems this will cause. Is it feasible, Economical, Ect.

Chairman Tinsley turned this over to the Space Alocation Committee and recommended that they not go into detail but to arrive at a recommendation of what should this committee do with this request and report at the next meeting as a guide for the chairman as to where to go.

Verne Brown and General Telephone graciously offered to host the next meeting to be held August 2, 1968 in the Tampa, St. Petersburg area.

Following a wonderful lunch hosted by Mr. Jim Tinsley, Southern Bell Tel. and Tel. the meeting was adjourned.
