The minutes of the last meeting was adopted as mailed.

#### OLD BUSINESS

Mr. Karl Lolman again mentioned the problem of obtaining participation from county officials at the local utility group meetings. Mr. Verne Brown said he would be glad to help any group with this problem. Mr. Ernest Salley stated that the Department of Transportation would be willing to be of assistance in preparing letters to various county officials suggesting their attendance at local utility group meetings.

Marion Gilliam, Chairman of the Utility Space Allocation subcommittee, passed out a sketch of a proposed space allocation for utilities. After some discussion by those present it was decided to remove the five foot distance from the right-of-way to the pole in the Curb and Gutter section, and insert an "x" distance from the face of the curb to the pole; remove at the bottom of the page the notes related to "x" distance for various speed conditions and include a note to determine "x" refer to the State Accommodation Guide; change the "note" at the bottom of the page to read, "Since gas transmission and distribution will not normally occupy both side of the right-of-way, these locations could be used interchangeably"; in the rural section change the "x" distance to be from the edge of the pavement to the face of the pole. The motion was made and seconded to adopt this Space Allocation Guide with the above changes. The motion passed. The guide is attached with the minutes.

#### NEW BUSINESS

Verne Brown announced that a public hearing regarding the adoption of the State Utility Accommodation Guide will be held on November 13, 1969 at 11:30 A.M. at the Hillsborough County Courthouse in Tampa, Florida. Mr. Brown outlined the various changes in the guide.

The chairman distributed copies of the revised 1969 PPM 30-4.1 and circular memorandum. Verne Brown presented a brief history and accomplishments of the Florida Utilities Coordinating Committee. This is attached to the minutes.

Ken Brown showed the film entitled "What Will It Cost You". This film belongs to Tampa Electric Company and they will loan it to other utility groups for showing.

The quarterly meeting of the American Right-of-Way Association will be held on December 11 and 12, 1969 at the Americana Hotel in Miami Beach, Florida.

# Malcolm Yancey Dies at Age 73

Wallahassee Bemorrat

Malcolm N. Yancey, former Tallahassee city manager and father of golf pro Bert Yancey, died yesterday of an apparent heart seizure.

The 73-year-old retired State Road Department engineer was pronounced dead on arrival at Tallahassee Memorial Hospital shortly after 4 p.m.

Graveside services will be

held at 4 p.m. Friday at Oakland Cemetery with the Rev. George Telford officiating and assisted by Dr. Lawrence 1. Stell of Atlanta.

Born in Port Republic, Va., Yancey had lived in Tallahassee since 1923 and wound up a public service career which spanned nearly half a century two years ago

upon his retirement as engineer of right-of-way for the old SRD.

He started with the Road Department in 1919 as an inspector while attending the University of Florida.

After receiving his B.S. Degree in civil engineering Yancey began rising through the department ranks, serving as an instrument man, chief of surveying party and then in 1927 was appointed assistant district engineer for Northwest Florida. Ten years later he was made district engineer.

In late 1939, Yancey left the department to become city manager of Tallahassee, a position he held for 12 years and one month.

He resigned that post in February 1952 and returned to the SRD as engineer of rightof-way.

Yancey was a member of the Sauls-Bridges Post of American Legion of which he was commander in 1948, the Tallahassee Lions Club, Elks and First Presbyterian Church.

He lived with his wife, Anna Mae Yancey, at 3510 Affaly
