NOVEMBER 4, 1994

Chairman Hall expressed appreciation for the time and participation of Mr. Bill Deyo and Mr. Freddie Simmons, of FDOT Central Office, at the combined interest group meeting held on November 3, 1994.

Chairman Hall also thanked Dennis LaBelle and Arlene Brown McGee for their efforts in selecting the speakers for the combined interest group and the quarterly business meetings.

Chairman Hall asked Mr. Jim Weeks, the new State Utility Administrator, to introduce himself and give the Central Office Update.

Mr. Jim Weeks started by giving his phone number (904) 487-1949 or (904) 487-1700. Mr. Jim Weeks has an Engineering degree from the Tennessee School of Engineering. After graduating, he started working with a Consulting Firm, then the Pensacola County Public works, then as State Specification's Engineer, and last with Florida Keys Aquatic Authority. His experience with utilities is with Water, Sewer, and Drainage. He indicated that the roll of the Central Office in a decentralized mode, is in training, maintenance, construction, utility relocation schedules, statewide continuity, and to help utilities when there is a difference between utilities and the Districts. He indicated that the goals and objectives of the Utilities and the FDOT are the same from different perspective and points of view; that is the public service in the form of a utility service or transportation service.

- ⇒ **METRICATION**, the deadline for all project to be designed and built in metric is still 9/96.
- ⇒ **CADD**, Electronic production of the plans is in the near future.
- ⇒ **PERMITS**, please work with your District on any issue related to permits. Jim Weeks will be glad to help coordinate any specific issue with the District. Mr. Jim Weeks will check into the new (proposed) utility permit which was distributed for use in one of the Districts. "It seems like it was a mistake to distribute the permit which is not approved yet", he said.
- ⇒ **R-R-R**, relocation of poles for resurfacing projects does not make any sense; however a method, process, and/or a program over a long period of time may be necessary to relocate poles which are hazardous for traveling public. When a pole or a pole line does not meet the R-R-R set-back criteria, a variance is needed and can be signed by the FDOT District Design Engineer. In cases where a pole or a pole line violates the AASHTO set-back requirements, the variance must be submitted to the State Design Engineer or a designee. As mentioned in the combined interest group meeting, the University of Florida is currently doing a study to prioritize and set up a system for evaluating which poles are the most hazardous pole; however the challenge is that how safe is safe and how high is high?
- ⇒ **HIGHWAY LIGHTING**, we are discussing highway lighting options at this time and we will be working with the industry (Highway Lighting Subcommittee) to finalize it. He also indicated that he would try to attend as many District coordination meetings as possible.

Chairman Hall told attendees that the checkout time is 12:00 noon.

## **PROGRAM**

Dennis LaBelle introduced Mr. Vernon Ford of Florida Power & Light who was the guest speaker. The subject of presentation by Mr. Vernon Ford was,

## **TAKING ADVANTAGE OF ELECTRONIC MEDIA.**

Mr. Ford gave his phone number, (305) 552-3072 and his E-Mail address, VFORD@EMAIL.FPL.COM

- Some of the main points of presentation are as follows:
  - 1) The main reason for electronic communication is sharing information and the speed information is exchanged.
  - 2) Quick response to customers' needs can be accomplished by electronic communications.
  - 3) In the long term, save money but not necessarily time depending on type of application.
- **IBM MAIL** is one of the main systems where many services can be accessed from. For instance, the mainframe based E-Mail can be accessed from IBMMAIL. Remote access of the E-Mail is also possible from IBMMAIL. There are several other systems that can perform the similar to the IBM MAIL.
- **INTERNET:**
  - 4) Is a network that connects smaller networks electronically.
  - 5) The information super highway which is planned by Federal Government is the future of the electronic communications. In fact by the year 2015, every household is expected to have a personal computer (PC). Federal Government is the main user of the INTERNET.
  - 6) There are a number of free of charge bulletin boards that may be accessed via INTERNET or Modem. If you would like a list of these bulletin boards, I will be happy to provide it for you. On line conversation is also possible via INTERNET.
  - 7) Some other content providers are CompuServe, PRODIGY, AMERICA ON-LINE, BROADCAST RADIOS, and ON-LINE VIDEOS.
  - 8) If you would like to find out more about the INTERNET, please contact your Information Technology (IT) or Telecommunication (TC) departments. Some public libraries also provide free information and/or training on INTERNET.
- For your information, FP&L has replaced 8500 terminals with PC work station, in the 18 months; and will replace remaining terminals to PC in the near future. We have also replaced the mainframe based E-Mail with Server based E-Mail which provides a lot more options, functions, and flexibility's. We have installed the Lotus Notes and Lotus Form package which enable us to eliminate all paper forms.
- One area of interest is the electronic Signatures which will be out within the next 18 months.

Mr. Vernon Ford opened for questions from the floor.

- ◊ Mr. Tom Kennedy,
  - Q. How many people have access to INTERNET, CompuServe, etc.?
  - A. About 25 to 30 % of the floor.
- ◊ Mr. Larry Claxon,
  - Q. How the authority for signatures could be handled?
  - A. Different levels of authorization may be incorporated in a table, also the Login and Password in to the system may be utilized. At the present time there are no universal standards for signatures as there are for E-Mail and other packages.
- ◊ Mr. John Jernigan,
  - Q. What will be the price or cost saving?
  - A. For FP&L a 3 to 4 million Dollars in cost saving when changed to PC work station. You may still get access to information highway from mainframe, but there are restrictions that apply.
- ◊ Mr. Jerry Sasser,
  - Q. Can large CADD files be transferred electronically?
  - A. Yes, but extremely large files may have difficulty in transferring. In those cases an alternative method may be searched for.
- ◊ Mr. Glen Cock,
  - Q. Can waiver of corporate seal be eliminated from the permits? (to Mr. Jim Weeks)
  - A. Mr. Jim Weeks will check into this and let us know of results.
- ◊ Mr. Scott Huff,
  - Q. Do you have any experience with Mobil Data Terminals?
  - A. Yes, in about five years most of top management in businesses may not have a permanent office, the Mobil data terminals will be the main tool for performing their duties. Wireless modems may be of a large use.

### ***FDOT DISTRICT REPORTS***

- **DISTRICT I,**  
District I met on September 7, 1994, in Fort Myers, Florida. Safety, OSHA trenching requirements were discussed. Next steering committee meeting is scheduled for 1/11/95 and the liaison meeting for 3/8/95.
- **DISTRICT II,**  
Mr. Vince Krepps gave the report for the District. The fall meeting was held on 10/28/94 with 60 people in attendance. Speakers at the meeting were Paul Kaczorowski, Ken Morefield, and Vince Camp.
- **DISTRICT III,**  
Mr. Ken Hood gave the report for the District. The upcoming steering committee meeting will be in 1/95 with the coordination meeting scheduled for 2/95. Currently they have 450 construction projects and would like to see participation from all agencies involved.
- **DISTRICT IV,**  
Mr. Rockey DePrimo, District Utility Engineer, reported that District IV continues to mail out its monthly production and letting lists. If you wish to be placed on the mailing list, please contact Kelly Cramer at (305) 777-4125.
- **DISTRICT V,** No reports were given.
- **DISTRICT VI,** No reports were given.
- **DISTRICT VII,**  
Mr. Steve Tidwell District Utility Engineer, reported that the District VII Utility Liaison Committee fall meeting was held in Crystal River at the Plantation Inn Golf & Tennis Resort. Key note speakers were District Secretary Bill McDaniel, P.E. and District Director of production, Kenneth A. Hartmann, P.E.

George Adrianssen, District CADD manager provided the direction the Department is taking in electronic transfer of data and plans. There were approximately 110 in attendance. The Spring meeting is scheduled for 3/24/95 at the Clearwater Beach Holiday Inn Surfside. Agendas are forthcoming.

#### • **TURNPIKE DISTRICT,**

- 1) Mr. Jim Haynie, Utility Administrator for Turnpike District, reported that on July 15, 1994, the Turnpike became a FDOT District by legislative act and it will be called Turnpike District not District VIII.
- 2) Turnpike open to traffic:
- 3) Seminole County Expressway, from Altma Avenue -- Winter Park to SR 500 (US17) in Sanford.
- 4) Veterans Expressway Tampa from approximately SR 60 Dale Mabrey north of Tampa.
- 5) Turnpike made phase I utility contract on SR 80 (Southern Blvd.) in West Palm Beach that was our first complete metric project. The phase I meeting will be held on 11/17/94 at PBS&J, Inc. Office in West Palm Beach.

#### **UTILITY NOTIFICATION CENTER REPORT, Mr. Bill Heath**

- 1) In 1994 we had 385,000 requests compared to 212,000 in 1993.
- 2) The ticket volume has increased by 83 % since it began in December of 1993.
- 3) Total of 225,000 calls were received this year.
- 4) A one day record of 3,120 phone calls was recorded on 10/3/94.
- 5) The average answering time for a phone call is about 20 seconds.

### **INTEREST GROUP REPORTS**

#### • **POWER -- Mr. Terry Vogel**

The power group met with 31 in attendance. Topics discussed were R-R-R requirements, GPS, OSHA vest requirement, and MOT.

#### • **TELEPHONE/TELECOMMUNICATIONS, Mr. John Jernigan**

The group met in the Flagler room with 24 present.

#### \* **OLD BUSINESS,**

- 1) Mr. Dave Bixler (MCI) gave update on environmental protection. 30 members on board representing utility industry. Next meeting is scheduled for 11/24/94. There are changes to policy and procedure.
- 2) Mr. John Jernigan (GTE), currently GTE is talking with FPC and TECO on electronic notification for pole transfer. They are looking at the Georgia System also.
- 3) Mr. Steve Arline (Aldephia Cable) is concerned that there is not a fourth party attachment space on notification as part of electronic pole transfers.
- 4) Mr. Dan Buol (AT&T) gave a detailed update on the one call system. (See One Call Organization for report)
- 5) Ms. Marilyn Pineau (Utility Consultants) updated the group on Joint Trench subcommittee activities.

#### \* **NEW BUSINESS,**

- 6) Mr. Bob Mewes (GTE) brought to the group attention a letter, dated 9/94, from the FDOT District V about a new permit that needed to be used. This permit reflects 27 changes and/or additions. There were some concerns about the non approved permits being sent out to Utilities to use.

#### • **UNDERGROUND, Mr. Mike Farmer**

The Underground group met with 12 in attendance. Joint Project Agreement pay item standardization --

- 1) Phase I, eliminating many excess/duplicate numbers and converting to metric is complete.
- 2) Phase II, finalization of industry specific construction specifications will be done next, will work with Mr. Carlos Solis on this.
- 3) OSHA has been increasing field inspectors resulting in more field visits.
- 4) FDOT is trying to make utilities get their own NPDES permit, rather than working under the FDOT's.
- 5) Discussed Joint Trench subcommittee activities that lead to a discussion about corridor locations in the R/W. In District II, the local utility coordinating committee has worked with Duval County to establish corridors for each type of pavement and right-of-way. It was decided agreements like this would have to be done at the local level to be effective.
- 6) Mr. Carlos Solis gave a brief update of Sunshine State One-call board meeting results.

Chairman Hall reinstated the Subcommittees and the chairpersons.

Utility Accommodation Manual and Standards Review Subcommittees were combined and will be chaired by Mr. Dennis LaBelle.

Joint Use Subcommittee will be chaired by Mr. Bill Hetherington.  
CSX/FDOT right-of-way Subcommittee will be chaired by Mr. Tom Duggar.  
Asbestos Subcommittee will be dissolved after the Subcommittee report today.  
FDOT Pay Item Standardization Subcommittee will be chaired by Mr. Carlos Solis.  
FDOT Highway Lighting Subcommittee will be chaired by Mr. Scott Huff.  
MOT Plates Subcommittee will be chaired by Mr. Hamid Zahir.  
One-Call Organization Subcommittee will be chaired by Mr. Dan Buol.  
Utility Networking Subcommittee, No chairperson at this time.  
Conference Planning Subcommittee will be chaired by Mr. Nick Zembillas.

  - 1) The existing manuals are available for your use at the front table, please make sure to get one or as many as you need.
  - 2) Also copies of the new Utility Invoice Procedure which is in effect now, are available at the front table.
  
- ◆ **JOINT USE,** Mr. Bill Hetherington
  - 1) Last meeting was held at the FPC offices in St. Pete on 10/27/94. We discussed the various parameters to do a joint trench services analysis. The Subcommittee is trying to determine the most cost effective process for coordinating and installation services. Next meeting has not been scheduled, but will probably be sometime in December. Any one interested in having input to this Subcommittee please Bill know.
  
- ◆ **CSX/FDOT,** Mr. Tom Duggar was not present at the meeting. (No report)
  
- ◆ **ASBESTOS,** Mr. Ray Reyburn
  - 1) There is no use for the Subcommittee anymore, if there is a need for the Subcommittee in the future it may be reinstated.
  - 2) The Asbestos rule does not apply to utilities; in fact, the pipe is still being manufactured.
  
- ◆ **FDOT PAY ITEMS,** Mr. Carlos Solis
  - 1) The Original Intent of the Subcommittee is met and he would like to recommend to expand the Subcommittee's efforts to develop standard spec.'s for every item that used in the JPA's.
  
- ◆ **FDOT HIGHWAY LIGHTING,** Mr. Scott Huff
  - 1) Again welcome Mr. Jim Weeks. The Subcommittee and I are looking forward to working with you to develop a mutually agreeable, cost effective alternative in highway lighting. Any interested party may join the Subcommittee by contacting me. No other progress to report since the FUCC summer meeting.
  
- ◆ **MOT PLATES,** Mr. Hamid Zahir
  - 1) We will be meeting with the FDOT MOT Committee in the near future. We appreciate Mr. Freddie Simmons' help in making this possible.
  
- ◆ **ONE-CALL ORGANIZATION,** Mr. Dan Buol
  - 1) The last board meeting was held on 11/2/94. A Subcommittee was established to develop software for an engineering locate notification. We are asking for your input. - 2) Thanks to Mr. Dennis LaBelle, Mr. Nick Zembillas, and the officers for a job well done.
- 3) The members were asked to please make suggestions for speakers and future programs.
- 4) Mr. Nick Zembillas suggested that we must improve and elevate our standings with the FDOT. This may require a change in the by-laws of the Committee and may require annual membership fees. Therefore, a Subcommittee (STRATEGIC PLANNING) was formed with several members and will be Chaired by Mr. Nick Zembillas.
- 5) Mr. Ray Reyburn, the Asbestos Subcommittee chairman, suggested to dissolve his Subcommittee.
- 6) The Power group suggested that the Utility/FDOT partnership meetings be changed to Utility Preconstruction meeting and be limited for up to four hours. At the present time, these meetings last for up to two full days. Most Utilities can not afford to engage in such meetings for more than four hours. Mr. Terry Vogel will draft up a letter for Mr. Dave Hall's signature that will be sent to Mr. Jim Weeks for handling.
- 7) It was suggested and approved that the UAM and STANDARDS REVIEW Subcommittees be combined and be chaired by Mr. Dennis LaBelle.
- 8) The Committee talked about the possibility of publishing a News Letter by the FUCC. This will be discussed in the future and a report will be provided for the group.
