Chairman Arlene Brown-McGee called the Summer meeting of the Florida Utilities Coordinating Committee to order at 8:35 a.m. with 98 registered members and representatives in attendance. Mr. Rob Hudack offered the invocation and Chairman McGee led the pledge to the Flag. Chairman McGee introduced the FUCC Officers, welcomed three new first time participants, recognized the local and district group officers/representatives and then called for self introductions by the attendees. She also thanked our Conference Planners, M&T Consultants, Inc., (Margie and Amber) for doing a great job on the last two FUCC conferences.

SECRETARY'S REPORT - John Jernigan

The minutes from the May 3, 1996 meeting in Stuart were accepted as written. All members were advised to keep the Secretary informed of changes in mailing addresses and changes to area codes and phone numbers. Internet addresses will also be carried in the FUCC data base.

HISTORIAN'S REPORT - Tom Duggar

FIFTY YEARS AGO - August, 1946 - Sarasota, Florida No minutes of this meeting.

TWENTY FIVE YEARS AGO - August 6, 1971, Holiday Inn, Daytona Beach, Florida

Attendance: Telephone 12, Power 13, Gas 2, DOT 7, County 2, Consultants 1, City 1, with a total of 38.

Mr. Salley-DOT State Utility Engineer, presented a film entitled "The Moving Challenge", an excellent program developed by the DOT depicting the tremendous transportation problems associated with Florida's continually increasing population and tourism. A slide presentation was also presented by the DOT Engineer of Traffic Operations establishing the necessity for standardization of traffic control devices and systems. Examples were shown of DOT projects where inadequate and nonuniform traffic control and warning systems were utilized. Deficient traffic control systems result in unnecessary hazards to the motoring public and a lack of inherent trust by the public in the systems warning devices. The speaker suggested that the utility industry relate the DOT practices to their respective procedures and initiate improvements as required. A subcommittee was formed to study and recommend a color code for subsurface facilities.

TREASURER'S REPORT - John Jernigan reported for Hamid Zahir that the FUCC now has a checking account with the ability to accept checks for meeting registration. The checks can be made out to FLORIDA UTILITIES COORDINATING COMMITTEE or utilize the check stamp available at the sign in desk.

GUEST SPEAKER - Dennis J. Connolly, Senior Program Manager ICF KAISER ENGINEERS GROUP, provided a slide presentation on the Miami International Airport Intermodal Center. The Miami Intermodal Center (MIC) is intended to provide an efficient, integrated multimodal transportation hub that offers enhanced mobility for the community, goods and services. The MIC is proposed to serve as the central transfer point for a wide variety of transportation modes including light, commuter, and heavy rail, and future High Speed Rail. The MIC will also become an extension of Miami International Airport, and accommodate selected landside terminal functions. The Project is sponsored by the Florida Department of Transportation with ICF Kaiser Prime Consultant is leading the effort in preliminary engineering, design and preparation of environmental impact documents. The University of Florida has played a research and development role through its College of Architecture Education and Research Center.

The MIC is proposed as the United States' first intermodal facility to serve as a hub for Amtrak; Tri-Rail; Metrorail; future High Speed Rail services between Miami, Orlando and Tampa; bus; taxi; private automobile; bicyclists and pedestrians. The MIC would also house selected airport landside terminal functions, such as ticketing and baggage service, and would be connected to MIA via a fixed guide way connector, the MIC/MIA Connector. In addition, the MIC would accommodate the Airport/Seaport Connector, to provide premium rail services between the Airport and the Seaport.

FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION UPDATE - Billy Hattaway

Billy Hattaway-State Roadway Design Engineer provided a Central Office Update and a status of the ongoing search for a replacement to fill Jim Weeks' position of State Utility Engineer. Mr. Hattaway stated a requirement for the position would be for the candidate to be a registered P.E.. The State Roadway Design Office is currently involved in a Totals Quality Management journey to improve their internal processes by surveying customers statewide. External customers will be contacted in the future.

FDOT DISTRICT REPORTS -

TURNPIKE - Dietmar Ungar

Jim Haynie is forming a Utility Task Team. The object of the team is to devise a plan to accurately locate and record the location of utilities on Turnpike right of way. One of the most difficult to locate are PVC water lines placed by DOT personnel without a permit.

Plan of Action: 1. Locate existing facilities using conventional locating techniques as well as underground (subsurface) engineering.
2. Recording the locations on a data base like CADD or Micro station.
3. In the future, everyone (DOT included) will need a permit to do work on Turnpike right-of-way. Information from the permits will be used to update the data base.

DISTRICT I - Jerrold Whitt - FDOT

The next District I Liaison Conference will be held on September 11, 1996 at the Mariners Inn in North Fort Myers. Topics will include: JPA'S and the Future of Utility Subsurface Engineering, MOT through the utility work zone, Current Utility issues and District I work program by W.L.Childs, and announcement of the new District I Secretary. Electronic (Utility) Permitting is being pursued through a pilot project in Ft. Myers and possibly one in Polk County.

DISTRICT II - Vince Krepps, ICF Kaiser for Vince Camp- FDOT

District II had their Spring meeting in April at the Holiday Inn in Lake City. The Fall meeting will be held in October also at the Holiday Inn in Lake City. The Steering committee is in the process of setting up a program and speaker invitations.

DISTRICT III - Don Boutwell - FDOT and Tom Duggar - Sprint

The District III Utility Liaison Committee will host the Summer Meeting on August 23, 1996 at the Harbor House Restaurant in Panama City, Florida. Registration will be a 8:30 am CST. The program will include: DOT update-Five Year plan by Gene Martin, Task Team update by Jimmy Rodgers-DOT, and Benefits Using GIS by Jeff Carnes-GEOFOCUS.

District III is getting very energetic with utility company's from job letting to preconstruction meetings and trying to improve communications between FDOT, contractor and utility companies. Also coordination of utilities on a large bridge project in Pensacola, three large projects in Tallahassee, and three bridges in Blountstown (SR20). The SR29 project in Pensacola is now going smooth after many problems with utilities and drainage.

DISTRICT IV - Rocky De Primo - FDOT

District IV continues to mail out to the utilities within the district's monthly status report of Production and Lettings for all projects in an 18 month window that are active. The District IV Utility staff participates in every local monthly utility coordinating meeting within the district.

DISTRICT V - Joe Nero - FDOT

The District V Liaison Conference for the Summer/Fall of 1996 has not been scheduled at this time. The District Utility office continues to work with all utility agencies through the spirit of cooperation and coordination. District V is also working on the enhancing strategies for better coordination between the utilities and designers in the early stages of plans development.

DISTRICT VI - Jim McGetrick - FDOT

The next District VI Liaison Committee meeting will be held in either September or October at the Rusty Pelican restaurant in Miami. Nothing new to report since the last meeting.

DISTRICT VII - Steve Tidwell - FDOT

The District VII Utility Liaison Committee is scheduled to meet September 20th at the Double Tree Resort on Clearwater Beach. Guest speakers are: District Secretary Bill McDaniel-Opening Remarks, District Construction Engineer Mike Irwin P.E., and I-4 Resident Construction Engineer Sandy Piccirelli, P.E.. The theme for this meeting is to discuss changes within the Department to improve quality and to address the Legislative Report (OPAGA), and how the Department intends to

reduce Supplemental Agreements to our highway projects, Other topics include better coordination, forecasted future projects, and advanced utility relocation. An update will be also provided by the Turnpike District on the progress of the Suncoast Parkway which will take off from the Veterans Expressway in Tampa, extending North through Pasco County and ending in Hernando County.

UTILITY NOTIFICATION CENTER REPORT - Dan Buol Executive Director

The legislative change for 1996 become effective October 1, 1996. The July Call Sunshine newsletter contains the changes and copies are available at the registration table. The next board meeting will be in Tallahassee on September 26, 1996. A legislative meeting will be held September 25, 1996 at 9:00 am at the Tallahassee City Hall. Call Sunshine is having a BBQ in Lakeland, Florida to end the "Call Before you Dig" week August 24, 1996. A flyer is available at the Registration Desk. Call volume at the Sunshine State One Call of Florida center over July of last year up 33.32%. New members total 193 and new associates members reached 44.

INTEREST GROUPS REPORT

POWER - Max Wallace

With 27 members in attendance the discussion items included:

1. FDOT Accommodation Manual
Manual revision with FDOT Task Team for manual met and no resolution to clear zone/r/w line installation of overhead utility facilities.
2. Discussion of calls from customers wanting to know, How much clearance do utilities have under conductors along waterways?
3. Railroad Agreement discussion
Fees- Any knowledge of utilities condemning for crossings.
Annual vs one time fee
4. Many requests for government attachments to utility poles.
5. Steve Tidwell- Utility downsizing, Is it the right size.
Support of FDOT projects by utilities may be effected.
ie: Design/Construction.
Time continues to be a concern.

TELECOMMUNICATIONS - Betsy Becker

The meeting of 32 members started with a review of old business.

1. Richard Harm-Sprint informs us that they were still having problems with Florida Central Railroad. The railroad is trying to increase the yearly lease cost, and unless the increased fees are paid on old crossings, they will not issue new permits. Earl Christian-Bell South stated they are having similar problems with Burlington-Northern R/R. The interest group will be keeping an eye on the type situation.
2. John Farkas- Bell South gave us an update on the electric transfer of permits he has developed for use in south Florida. There have been a few bugs in the operation but they have been overcome and he is optimistic that by September 1996 this will be completed.
3. Greg Williams-FDOT informed us that the UAM is sitting in DOT legal. Once the UAM finishes it travel in DOT. A workshop will be advertised so a final review can be accomplished.

New Business:

4. Larry Kelly-FDOT stated that the DOT is in the process of developing generic specs. Four are approved in the water and sewer area. Telecommunications is to be looked at in the near future. Anyone interested in being involved, please contact him.
5. Dennis Black- Time Warner mentioned that he wanted everyone to be aware of the effect of the 3R projects. Also concerned about the reimbursables or lack thereof.

6. Richard Harm-Sprint had a question for DOT. If there is the great concern of poles being in the clear zone, then why are we seeing so many palm trees and other trees being newly planted in the median and inches off curbs?

7. Dennis Black-Time Warner brought up the subject of municipalities trying to require utilities to place their facilities underground. After cost estimates are presented to the cities, they are saying it is too costly and it is put on hold or dropped. But the utilities are still incurring engineering costs to provide these proposals. How are these going to be paid for? Richard Harm-Sprint stated that Sprint was going to consider utilizing the tariffs to cover this.

8. Greg Williams- FDOT stated that the DOT is going to be installing Fiber Optic lines on the Limited Access Roads. This is to tie all their offices together. The plan is the DOT will have one-half of the fibers dedicated for DOT use and the other one-half will be available for everyone else. DOT would have a company to manage and maintain these lines. The utilities have concerns regarding this including: Keep the DOT from lease/selling their unused fibers?, How are the utilities to get access? and Overall concerns of the DOT getting into the Communications business?.

UNDERGROUND - Mike Farmer

Fifteen members in attendance prompted the following discussions:

1. Update on status of Utility Task Team by Mike Farmer and Dave Pellico.
 - Basically on hold until replacement for Jim Weeks is announced.
 - Will not meet again until September
 - UAM is now in FDOT Legal- unknown where it will go next.
2. Discussion of "Placed Out-of-Service" Facilities.
3. Update from Bill Heath on status of Call Sunshine relocation to Orlando.
4. Promotions Committee Activities
 - "Dangerous Weapons"- national billboard campaign
5. "News release" dealing with importance of locating buried facilities has been shown in several markets on 6:00 pm news.
6. Discussion of utilizing licensing agencies to mandate use of Sunshine One-Call at time of license renewals and applications.
 - Per Bill Heath, Construction Industry Licensing Board (CILB) does this to some extent.
7. Bill Heath clarified recent changes:
 - New enforcement section of 556 become effective on October 1, 1996. After that time, if an excavator does not call for locate, utility can call police.
 - Life of ticket as 20 calendar day vs current 10 working days. The 10 day rule has caused some confusion.
 - Mandatory membership will be taken up with the next legislative session.
 - Lengthy discussion of "Design Tickets", these remain a problem for both designers and the utilities.
8. Pinellas County emphasized the importance of City and County coordination with utilities during design. They should have one point of contact for these issues.
9. Sunshine in conjunction with PTEC is offering a Utility Locating Course featuring theory and hands on. This will be expanded outside Pinellas County.

COMBINED INTEREST GROUPS

Vice Chairman Hamid Zahir introduced Patrick A. Brady, P.E. - Transportation Safety Engineer of the FDOT State Safety Office, who provided a presentation on MOT Training Course Evaluations and recommended changes. Mr. Brady requested that anyone with suggestions and recommendations to please contact his office in Tallahassee.

The following representatives offered preview of topics that are scheduled for the FDOT Design Conference, August 12-14th.

Tom Kennedy-Florida Power Corporation provided a presentation on the Utility Accommodation Manual and infrastructure management.

Dennis LaBelle-Tampa Bay Engineering provided a presentation on 3R Criteria and the Impact on Utilities.

Steve Tidwell-FDOT addressed the Joint Project Agreement Task Team Update. The last meeting was held in Pensacola in June and they agreed to not meet until the handbook was in "draft" form. Mr. Tidwell, Marsha Johnson and Larry Kelly met in Tampa last month with a follow-up plan this month to finish. What have we done?

1. Early Refund Directive/Procedure
2. Flow Chart of the JPA process
3. Generic Spec
4. Handbook (detailed)
5. Defined Comp Book Standards
6. Refined Financial Arrangements/Agreement
7. Automated Change Order

Utility Adjustment Plans-Kim Wiley will assist in this Presentation on commonly omitted data or errors that are typically identified during the Plan Phase Reviews. Also discussion on the benefits that are obtained from "good" utility adjustment sheets.

STRATEGIC PLANNING- Stan Nurnberger

Strengths identified:

1. Technical and operational knowledge
2. Open communications
3. Diverse organizational membership
4. Broad statewide geographical representation

Weaknesses identified:

1. No formal ties to local and district UCC'S
2. Not a balanced participation by types of organization, small vs large, investor owned vs government
3. Lack of mission statement and strategic plan
4. Poor delegation of issue responsibility

MISSION- Improve the efficiency of operation, maintenance and construction of utility and roadway infrastructure through communication, discussion of issues, educational opportunities, and facilitating cooperative relationships.

These goals are in addition to traditional activities of the FUCC.

GOAL- Increase broad based participation (membership) from all potential member organizations. Establish a standing Membership & Promotions subcommittee to meet this goal. Develop and disseminate a promotional FUCC flyer that identifies FUCC and solicits new members.

GOAL- Hold well planned, well organized informative meetings. Establish a Conference Planning subcommittee to hire, provide direction, oversee and evaluate conference planner contractors/consultants. The four officers will retain the joint responsibility for selecting and organizing programs for the quarterly meetings.

GOAL- Secretary to publish and distribute a quarterly newsletter to include: latest meeting summary, names, company and telephone numbers of officers, interest group leaders, and subcommittee chairman, future meeting dates and locations, details of next meeting, description of FUCC, invitation and how to join FUCC, brief editorial of difficult issues, why they are of concern and status.

GOAL- Develop and maintain a mailing list (data base) of local and district UCC officers, appropriate Managers of companies, agencies, other industry associations, municipal and county public works, consulting engineering firms, construction contractors, vendors, railroads, and other (FHWA, ATSSA, FCG) who could mutually benefit from knowledge of FUCC.

GOAL- Officers and Subcommittee Chairs will develop educational update programs with a uniform message to deliver under the banner of FUCC to the local and district UCC'S. Officers and Steering Committee to implement

GOAL- Chairman shall communicate and record a clear set of objective and identify the person(s) responsible for all subcommittee and Task Teams of the FUCC.

Strategic Planning has met the current charge of the Steering Committee and is hereby disbanded.

UAM/STANDARDS REVIEW - Dennis LaBELLE

The UAM is currently in its final draft form. It has been reviewed by the utility industry and proposed changes were presented at the May FUCC meeting. The manual is going through the DOT Executive Review Process and is currently in Legal review. Once the manual has completed the Executive Review, a general workshop will be scheduled to review the changes. The utility industry still has a few outstanding issues with the manual that need to be resolved. (1) Accommodation within right-of-way with limited border width area and (2) Intermediate pole installations permitting process.

JOINT USE- Bill Hetherington

No activity to report at this time. Currently soliciting someone to be the chairman.

FDOT PAY ITEMS- Carlos Solis

Final draft of water, sewer and gas specifications was mailed out to the different utilities. Minor comments have been received. FDOT will be publishing and adopting these specifications in the near future for use in conjunction with JPA contracts.

Telephone, Power and CATV specifications to be developed.

UTILITY NETWORKING- Tom Kennedy

The committee took on three general directions at the outset:

1. Encourage electronic communication
2. Facilitate the exchange of CADD drawings
3. Promote electronic permitting

The committee has provided presentations and workshops on electronic communications, permitting and CADD transfer.

The CADD Task Force has worked with FDOT to develop standards and procedures which will hopefully be in place in early 1997. We anticipate another CADD workshop at the February FUCC meeting. I would like to thank the CADD Task Force members for their work especially Bill Gerry, John Jenkins, Abby Bryant, John Mauthner, Shawn McGaffick, Mark Lindblom, Jan Sands Ash, Cynthia Swain and Bob Sievers.

Bill Hetherington has been leading the electronic permitting effort working through INTERLINE with Lee County and FDOT District One.

The three efforts of the Utility Networking Committee have evolved to the point where three individual subcommittees are warranted. A CADD Transfer subcommittee will focus on that effort, Jan Sands Ash has agreed to chair the subcommittee. An Electronic Permitting subcommittee will be formed with Bill Hetherington as Chair. The Utility Networking subcommittee will be renamed to the Utility E-mail subcommittee to focus on electronic communications other than CADD and permitting. Betsy Becker will Chair this new subcommittee.

THE MALCOLM YANCEY AWARD

This award is in honor of Mr. Malcolm Yancey, Civil Engineering graduate of the University of Florida who started with the State Road Department in 1919. He rose through the ranks to District Engineer. He then served 12 years as City Manager of Tallahassee before returning to the FDOT as Engineer, Right-of-Way. Mr. Yancey retired with forty eight (48) years of public service.

Malcolm Yancey was very active in the American Right-of-Way Association, as well as the Florida Utilities Coordinating Committee. He was one of the people responsible for the close coordination between the utilities and the Florida Department of Transportation that exists today. This is the "most prestigious award" the Florida Utilities Coordinating Committee can present to one of its members, and it may not be awarded except under very stringent conditions including exceptional dedication and effort in the leadership of the Florida Utilities Coordinating Committee. This year it was our great privilege to present the Malcolm Yancey Award to the long time employee of Florida Power & Light, presently with Tampa Bay Engineering, and constant champion of the goals and principles of the Florida Utilities Coordinating Committee, **DENNIS LABELLE**.
