Chairman Hamid Zahir called the Spring Meeting of the Florida Utilities Coordinating Committee to order at 8:32 a.m. and welcomed all new members to the meeting. There were 119 registered members and representatives in attendance. Mr. Rob Hudack offered the invocation and led the pledge to the Flag.

Chairman Zahir initiated and proceeded with self-introduction by the attendees. He also expressed appreciation and thanked the following sponsors for their support and assistance for this meeting:

Chairman Zahir also thanked our Conference Planners, M&T Consultants, Inc. for doing a great job setting up this meeting and for their creativity in preparing the new FUCC meeting agenda booklet for this meeting. Those corporations which would like to have their business advertised can do so, in the business section of the booklet.

Chairman Zahir commented that he had attended the National Joint Use and National Highway Utility Conference in Cleveland, which he found to be very informative and educational. He complimented those present who attended and made presentations at this national conference for their involvement and participation. Among those FUCC members in attendance to the National Joint Use and National Highway Utility Conference were: Bill Hetherington, Tom Kennedy, Dennis LaBelle, Steve Tidwell, and Nick Zembillas. He also acknowledged Ms. Reva Reed, Chairperson of the National Joint Use and National Highway Utility Committee, and welcomed her to the FUCC meeting.

## SECRETARY'S REPORT - Jacqueline Beebe

The minutes from the February 7th meeting held in Atlantic Beach were accepted as written. A motion followed to wave the reading of the minutes, the motion was seconded and passed.

## HISTORIAN'S REPORT - Tom Duggar

FIFTY YEARS AGO - May 1947 Chairman - J.T. Sparkman, Sumpter Electric Cooperative Secretary - Menendez, Southeastern Telephone Company No minutes of the meeting.

TWENTY-FIVE YEARS AGO - May 5, 1972, Holiday Inn, Hollywood, Florida Attendance: Telephone 15, Power 16, Gas 3, FDOT 9, Consultant 3, Cable TV 1, County 3, City 1 for a Total of 50.

A letter from Mr. Warner, President of the American Public Works Association was read. The letter stated that a committee had been appointed by the Florida Chapter of the APWA to work with the Florida Utility Coordinating Committee on the development of the utility space allocation standards. A letter to all district engineers was read stating that the Department of Transportation now had the in-house expertise to review utility bridge attachment designs with respect to corrosion problems. It was therefore no longer required that utility companies obtain and submit statements certifying the adequacy of the cathodic protection.

Recommendations of the Utility Space Allocation Subcommittee were read. Preliminary drawings were developed by the subcommittee indicating the proposed location for various utilities; the exhibits were reviewed and discussed by those present.

It was voted to have a subcommittee develop a resolution for review at the August meeting, siting conflicts and problems resulting from the indiscriminate location of signs. The resolution is to be submitted to Counties, municipalities, and agencies governing the installation of sign facilities.

Chairman Brown announced that the Legislature had passed a tax bill, effective July 1st, 1972. A portion of the funds collected were to be distributed to the municipalities and be used for reimbursing public works and utilities for relocation costs. Chapter VI of the Traffic Control Device Standard was discussed.

## TREASURER'S REPORT - Hamid Zahir

Reported balance of \$1,031.59 as of Wednesday, May 5, 1997; without proceeds from this meeting.

A proposal was presented by Chairman Zahir to the FUCC group pertaining to two compensation options made available to FUCC members attending the Summer meeting at the Marco Island Hilton, due to scheduled hotel renovation work. The options presented by Chairman Zahir were as follows:

Option #1 .- The hotel would credit each FUCC attendee's individual room account with a \$25.00/day food and beverage credit.

Option #2.- The hotel would credit the FUCC Master Account with a \$25.00/day food and beverage credit for each individual room reserved under the FUCC portfolio.

Members voted by ballot; votes were counted and Option #2 was selected.

## FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION UPDATE - Ken Weldon

Mr. Ken Weldon, State Utility Engineer, provided the attendees with the following status report:

- Utility Accommodation Manual and the Utility Permit .- These documents have been advertised in the May 2, 1997 issue of the Florida Administrative Weekly. The advertisement states that a workshop will be held in the FDOT Burns Building auditorium on May 23, 1997. The purpose of the workshop is to voice any concerns, objections and not for the purpose of argumentation. There will be no debates at this workshop. A hearing is expected to be held at a later date.
- Utility Relocation Schedule .- The Utility Office has completed the trial debugging and user comment phase of forms. It is now approved for use as an "Official Form". Use only those versions with the Form Number showing.

## GUEST SPEAKER - Tom Boyd, State Comptrollers Office

Mr. Boyd stated that the State Comptrollers Office has the most extensive cash forecasting system. Utility relocations on the Work Program are forecast as a local cost/funds. Mr. Boyd continued to explain the reason why the State requires money "up front" from Utilities prior to construction, since his office is required to certify that money is readily available for the project prior to construction. Close coordination with Utilities are handled via Joint Project Agreements in which funding/money is required to be provided to the State prior (14 days) to the advertisement date of the construction project.

Another area that Mr. Boyd talked about was the success that the State has had with consolidating invoicing/billing with utility companies such as JEA and Florida Power for utility services provided to the State. Utilities interested in consolidated billing can contact Mr. Boyd at (904)921-7112.

## FDOT DISTRICT REPORTS

## DISTRICT I - Jerrold R. Whitt

The March meeting was held in Bradenton on March 12th, 1997. There were 70 attendees at the meeting. The topics were :

- 1. How projects are identified and placed in the Work Program
- 2. Update on Electronic Utility Permitting.
- 3. Tampa Electric Company's new state-of-the-art Power Plant in Polk County.

The next District I Liaison meeting will be scheduled for September, tentatively the 10th. Possible topics or speakers could be on utility lobbying in the Legislature. The Steering Committee will be scheduled to meet in July.

## DISTRICT II - Vince Camp

The District II Utility Liaison Committee will meet June 2nd, 1997, in Lake City at the I-75 Holiday Inn. Meeting is scheduled from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. This meeting will consist of a Vendor Show/Exhibit in the morning. The District will present the Five-Year Work Program, the new Utility Relocation Schedule, and proposed changed to the UAM.

## DISTRICT III - Carmen Guffey

The next District III Liaison meeting is scheduled for August, at the Harbour House in Panama City, Florida. The meeting will be held form 8:30 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. The topics for the meeting will be the Five-Year Plan Update and new officers elections.

The Spring meeting was held on February 28, 1997, with 65 in attendance. Topics of discussion were: draft guidelines for clearing and grubbing, DOT and utility delays, and the Five-Year Plan.

### DISTRICT IV - Rocky DePrimo

District IV continues to mail out to all the utility companies in the area a monthly status report of all the projects within an 18-month window of production. The District also mails out the monthly status of all project lettings within an 18-month window.

- Alternate Contracting User's Guide The Central Office has prepared a booklet called "Alternate Contracting User's Guide -Draft March 1997". This booklet is to assist and provide information pertaining to what to expect on projects identified as candidates for bidding under the Alternate Contracting Method. Be aware relocation schedules are more critical than ever before and failure to meet them places the Utilities subject to penalties in excess of \$7,000/day in the event of delays in the Contractor's schedule.
- Joint Participation Agreement Research .- The Request for Proposal will be advertised May 2, 1997 in the Florida Administrative Weekly. Proposals are due 06/05/97. Posting begins and ends 06/12/97 -06/17/97.
- Revised Pole/Post Research Scope of Services The Utility Office has submitted this to Dr. Najafi of the University of Florida for review and consideration as of 05/02/97. Emphasis has been placed on determining causes for accidents and probability of impact rather than prioritizing pole impact locations.
- Pole Task Team. The task team met on April 24, 1997 in the Tampa District Office. Each of the FDOT's responses on how is intended to meet the FUCC's utility issue requests were discussed. The Pole Team is to respond in writing stating which responses are acceptable and what if any require further clarification. The FDOT Utility Section will begin drafting some specific training guidelines and Plans Preparation Manual revisions for implementation of the responses agreed to. These guidelines will be the basis for the FDOT's next meeting June 19 in Tallahassee finalize improvements the Department is making in its manuals to accommodate the needs of the Utility.
- Claims Task Team .- The task team met April 25, 1997 in the Tampa District Office to re-establish goals and objectives. A decision was made to finalize the study and draft recommendations to submit to the DOT. It is anticipated that the tentative submittal date and presentation will occur by August 19, 1997.
- Nationwide Survey of Pole Horizontal Clearance and Clear Zone .- It will be completed and submitted to the Districts June 1, 1997. This will place greater emphasis on being more practical on Foot's approach.
- Training Needs Statewide The Utility Office is attempting to determine training needs statewide for the purpose of dealing with Utility issues. Training will be scheduled in the Miami, Orlando, and Lake City areas.
- TEA 1996 Policy .- The Central Office has developed a TEA 1996 Policy as of April 1, 1997. Copies may be obtained from Mr. George Herndon, Chairman, TCA Task Force. (Phone: [904] 488-5596.
- Update Certificate of Incumbency .- The Central Office Utilities Section is in the process of developing a new Certificate of Incumbency Authorization Form.

Mr. Tom Kennedy inquired to Mr. Weldon about the May 2, 1997 Administrative Weekly announcing Rule 14-46.001 being repealed, with part of the language included in Subsection (8) of the amended Rule 14-46.001 apparently eliminating the basic concept of project planning and development considering the cost of the utility work as part of the project planning and development. Mr. Weldon stated that to his knowledge no change had been made to the language, and that if there was in fact, a change made by the Legal Office without his knowledge, that the revised language could be restructure to say the same as previously noted. Mr. Weldon added that he would bring this matter up at the workshop and expressed the Utilities' objection to this change.

## GUEST SPEAKER - Mark Hopkins, FDOT Program Development Office

Mr. Hopkins delighted us with a presentation on the Florida's Five Year Work Program and its preparation process. He stated that the Executive Committee will start as of May of this year, to go through a series of workshops to review program policies to see what needs to be changed and to determine what the priorities are to be for the Work Program. He added that the Work Program is evaluated and reviewed each year to measure the performance and for adherence to the State's goals and objectives. Limited amount of Money makes this a challenging task. The priorities for the Program are as follows:

## 1) Safety Programs

- 2) Preservation Programs
  - -Maintenance (resurfacing 80% of facilities have to meet level of service)

Mr. Hopkins explained that the Five-Year Work Program goes to the Legislature for approval. Once the Legislature approves what is in the Work Program and funding is allocated; the FDOT works on implementing the Program. The State is fortunate in that there is a stable situation with the transportation taxes and a very stable construction cost index; with no major fluctuations or major changes experienced in inflation. Federal Aid does not cover routine maintenance.

District VII held the Spring Liaison Conference in Tampa at the Doubletree Resort Hotel, this past March. Approximately 120 were in attendance.

Lucy Ayres, Director of Tampa/Hillsborough MPO, spoke on the new projects that the Community Tax (Stadium Tax) has influenced. The next meeting is scheduled for September. ## **UTILITY NOTIFICATION CENTER REPORT** - Bill Heath

Tickets through the end of April are 285,259 - showing an increase of 17.27% from last year. Transmissions year to date have increase 14.66%. Number of members - 217 Number of Associate members - 58 The record breaking day was 1/21/97 with 5,077 tickets Amendment to F.S. 556 for comprehensive membership went before the Legislature. Amendment to F.S. 556 for a hand digging exemption went before the Legislature. Both passed the House and Senate.

## **REPORT** by Carlos Solis

The Board has voted to bring the operations in-house. This is a period of transition between now and end of December 1998; part of this transition is going to call for improved technology and improved mapping.

The Board has a membership meeting the 22nd of May and all utilities are invited to attend this meeting. Carlos Solis also informed the group that the Underground Locate Council is looking at reviewing the color coding chart to include one or two additional colors for reclaimed water systems and any other utility.

There were 23 in attendance. The topics of the group discussion were as follows:

1) Utility Accommodation Manual .- Discussion was centered on the use of a checklist for State permits. The use of the checklist would be beneficial for the Utility to assure that compliance to all state requirements such as dimensions from state roadway in addition to local roadway is achieved. Sign-off of the list by all District Maintenance Engineers would happen prior to implementation of the checklist so that all District Maintenance Engineers would be in agreement that those items on the checklist are the requirements. Also inquiries and questions were raised on how the PPM (Plans Preparation Manual) revisions were decided upon and how information about these type of revisions were disseminated to the Utilities.

It was also expressed at this meeting, that the 2-1/2 hours of discussion on the UAM during that morning; determined that additional meeting times with members prepared to discuss issues and concerns is a must.
