### **Permitting**

Chaired by Jan Ash, Ayers Associates

A total of 12 - were in attendance and discussed the following:

Anthony Gilmore of CSX- spoke about new permitting criteria and clearances. The new portal and permitting process was discussed. The CSX website is a wealth of information. The permit review team in Jacksonville consists of 6-8 people. Online payments is still being worked on, so each permittee will receive an invoice for the permit fee. Permit timeframe is about 30-90 days for processing,

There was in inquiry about how to find milepost information. There is no website that can really show the CSX mile posts. An inquiry will be presented to CSX on how a permittee can research the mileposts.

Sunrail crossing permits are taking exceptionally long to process. As is it was determined the Sunrail permit goes through the FDOT OSP portal. Then the permit application gets forwarded to CSX for review. That is one of the reasons it takes a while.

Two issues were brought up about OSP:

- Any project longer than two miles will not fit on the location map. You cannot pin both ends of the projects. Currently users must pin the center of the project.
- There is no clear direction on who the contractor should be. Should it be the utility or the actual construction contract. Guidance must be provided on how that entry is used.

#### **Design Build**
