### A Note from Pastor Prentice...

Has anyone been in a boat or a ship? If you have, was it big or small? One thing for sure, when the anchor is pulled up, the walkway is stowed; you begin to pull away from shore, you are stuck on that boat! Whether you are a few passengers or many, you are all fellow "sailors" on that boat, all sailing together on the water. Water, the sea, it has often represented chaos and trouble in the Bible. Yet as we study our Gospel of St. Mark, the disciples were often in the boat sailing from shore to shore. Whether battling the storms, or discussing miracles, etc., a whole lot of things happened in the boat; but a key thought is this, Jesus was "in the boat" with them. Jesus calmed the storms; Jesus set them straight on errors in their thinking about miracles, etc.

Faith Lutheran is like a boat (follow me). We set sail in our service, and

leave shore to spend some quality time sailing...but always sailing with Jesus. Jesus is present in His Word and in His Sacraments. Jesus is through the liturgy (the setting of the service), the Word preached, hymns sung, Scripture listened to, the Eucharist consumed; Jesus is calming the storms of life and preparing us for (OK, sounds corny), our final voyage to heaven. The presence of Jesus is always with us, His people in the Church, especially in our intimate setting as we gather around the altar at Faith. Wonderful!

Back to boats though. They need maintenance, they need upkeep, they need to plan the voyage, they also need to look ahead to prepare for the future. Churches do to!

If you are not aware, Faith has been on this journey for 75 years in 2023. If you have read the history (on the web now), Faith was a mission plant in 1948...and services began (we set sail). In 1949, we became a charted congregation under the name Faith Lutheran.

Now I remember years ago (I have been here for 65 years), many thought, "It was nice to see 50"; but 25 years latter...still going. So it is time to celebrate for one, and then look ahead. So I have some ideas.

- 01) In 2023, let us begin to celebrate the mission of Faith and also look ahead to the mission of Faith for the next bunch of years. Perhaps we can also think about and study up on "what really is mission?" Then apply it to Faith and the future.
- 02) As 2024 approaches, let us plan to celebrate 75 years of Word and Sacrament at this wonderful church. How? Not sure, but we should begin to chat about it.

That all said, let us kick off (OK, I got busy in January) 2023 as the Year of Mission at Faith. For my part, I hope to have some noted theologians come and speak about mission; I also hope we can formulate some plans for continued mission for years to come.

For just as Jonah was three days and three nights in the belly of the great fish, so will the Son of Man be three days and three nights in the heart of the earth. The men of Nineveh will rise up at the judgment with this generation and condemn it, for they repented at the preaching of Jonah, and behold, something greater than Jonah is here. (Matthew 12:38-41 - ESV)
