#### A Note from Pastor Prentice...

I really want to share with you one of the key passages in our Mark study (Mark 10:46-52) -

And they came to Jericho. And as he was leaving Jericho with his disciples and a great crowd, Bartimaeus, a blind beggar, the son of Timaeus, was sitting by the roadside. [47] And when he heard that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to cry out and say, "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!" [48] And many rebuked him, telling him to be silent. But he cried out all the more, "Son of David, have mercy on me!" [49] And Jesus stopped and said, "Call him." And they called the blind man, saying to him, "Take heart. Get up; he is calling you." [50] And throwing off his cloak, he sprang up and came to Jesus. [51] And Jesus said to him, "What do you want me to do for you?" And the blind man said to him, "Rabbi, let me recover my sight." [52] And Jesus said to him, "Go your way; your faith has made you well." And immediately he recovered his sight and followed him on the way.

Up to now in Mark's Gospel account, Jesus was a bit silent on whom He was, but not now, silence is not an option. A blind man sees, cries out for mercy; and even though the crowds told him to "shut up", he could not. This Jesus, the Son of God, the Messiah, the Savior of the world stopped what He was doing, called for him, and Jesus nicely asked, "what do you want?" To be healed was the answer, and Jesus did not just heal him, but most importantly, Jesus reminded him of his faith. Yes, we may be healed of bodily ills, but the soul needs Jesus, and we get that by faith as we follow Him.

This man simply did not run home all happy (OK, maybe at some point), but he followed Jesus because his sight was healed. Not just his sight of images and trees, etc., but his "sight" of Jesus and what Jesus offers.

That is why we need to follow Jesus, no matter what happens. And what do you get when you follow Jesus? If we go all the way back to the first chapter of Mark, a demon is one of the first to recognize Jesus as the Son of God, with divine power and authority; and Jesus destroys all powers of darkness and sin, that would hope to overcome us.

It takes faith to receive all the power that Jesus offers, which is eternal salvation for a fallen soul. Oh, the demon knows of God, but has no faith; we by the power of the Holy Spirit, as we receive the Word of God, as we receive the Sacraments often; we follow Jesus, just as the no longer blind man does...all the way to heaven when our last breath on earth occurs.

Finally, notice the word "immediately", often used by Mark, when you put your faith in Jesus, you do not work you way over time to be healed...it is immediate.

We still bask in Easter joy, so continue to follow Jesus. And perhaps a little 75th Anniversary Mission reminder, the blind man could not be silent...so you too, when a chance is given, do not be silent (maybe an invite to Faith Church is a nice start). Share the joy of Christ, and how you are healed by Christ's death and glorious resurrection.
