Thank you, thank you, thank you

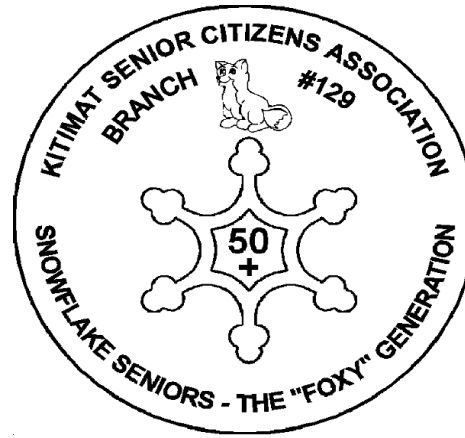
We would like to extend a big thank you to everyone who was involved with the Seniors' Week celebrations Monday to Friday.
