## **a fun** Flower Frog

A flower frog sits atop a vase to help arrange flowers and hold stems in place. This personalized frog will become a favorite!

#### What you need: • Air-dry clay • Roller • Vase (or jar) • Plastic knife



What you do: 1. Roll out a portion of clay to about ½-inch thickness.

- Cut out a circle that's slightly larger than the vase opening. (This will allow the finished frog to sit securely on top.)
  To make holes for stems, use a
- straw to punch out circle shapes. If you make more than one frog, try arranging the holes in different patterns
- Let dry completely. Then personalize your work with acrylic paint.
- When dry, place the frog atop the vase. Arrange flowers and greenery to
- make a Mother's Day bouquet.

#### **Message From the Pastor**

By the time you read this article, the General Conference of The United Methodist Church, which is from April 23 – May 3 in Charlotte, NC, will be in session. The 2020 General Conference was postponed and is now finally taking place. There are 133 annual conferences from around the world, with 55% of the delegates representing conferences from the U.S. and the remaining 45% of the delegates from the rest of the world. These are the major areas of legislation which are being presented:

regionalization, the general church budget, new African bishops, revised social principles, dealing with disaffiliations, same-sex weddings and "self-avowed practicing" gay clergy, ecumenical relationships, clergy focus, responses to sexual misconduct, students and special Sundays, treatment of girls and women, young people's ministries, older adult concerns, and Wespath — New clergy retirement plan. There are just three areas which I will share some background. The first is regionalization. The basic gist of the legislation is to create distinct regions which will have "the same duties and powers to pass legislation" in their own geographical areas. Currently, as the U.S. has the most delegates, legislation is usually biased towards the U.S. Setting up separate regions with their own legislative capabilities means each region would be able to make decisions which affect their geographical ministry areas in both a more timely and appropriate manner.

The second area is the budget of The United Methodist Church. A \$370.5 million budget is being proposed. This represents a 40% decrease from the previous budget. This budget, if passed, will mean a drop in what each conference is required to pay in its fair shares to The UM Church as a whole. Hopefully, this decrease will then be experienced by all the local churches in all the conferences.

The last legislation area is one which makes me sad to consider, but it may be important in the life of WUMC. There are a couple of disaffiliation proposals being considered. One of them came from our Susquehanna Conference, so Rev. Dr. Tom Salsgiver did make good on his word to us that he/his committee/our conference would put forth a disaffiliation piece of legislation.

Having given this very brief overview of what is being addressed at this important time in the life of The United Methodist Church, I ask that we all pray for our denomination. As happened last year as the deadlines for disaffiliation were approaching, there has been and is a lot of inaccurate and speculative "information" being shared. To be accurately informed, please go directly to the General Conference's official site to find out what's really transpiring.



Finally, the leadership team of WUMC knows that some pieces of legislation may affect the future of our church here in Winterstown. So, we have already scheduled a meeting for Sunday, May 19 (Pentecost) after worship. During this all-church meeting, we will share what actually happened at General Conference and then give everyone a chance to ask questions and/or share your thoughts and concerns. Let's please continue to behave lovingly and respectfully in the days ahead – especially towards people whose beliefs may not be the same as yours. Loving God and loving our neighbors as ourselves hasn't changed since Jesus said these actions are the two most important commandments.


