Double Run School, 1916, located between D.R. Swamp and Raulerson Hill on Double Run Road south of Little Lake Harris off SR 561.

1880 Clermont's Broome Street school located where present Woman's Club is today.

Minneapolis school, 1905, located at 100 S. Main St.

Ferndale, 1924 to 1964, is now used as bible school by Baptist Church. Forty or fifty feet west is location of 1st school used 1880's to 1924.

Lady Lake, 1905-1968, found in center of town and used now as community center.

Withlacoochee School, 1900-1941, located south of Groveland on SR 33 south. It lies 500 feet north of the SR 561 & 33 junction and is known as Klapper's corner. Mr. Harry Judy lives nearby and maybe of help.

Fruitland Park, 1885-1962, schoolhouse is now the city hall.
