FOSSIL SITES FOR THE TH'ER

Treasure isn't all metal detecting and relics. Fossils were here many years before any interest in the latter occurred. The following sites were found in a fossil book I came across. They cover the Miocene and Pleistocene period which include shells and vertebrates.

PONTE VERDE BEACH: This is located south of Jacksonville. Take SR A1A to Mickler's Landing and from this point to 8 miles south. Fossilized shark teeth can be found near tide areas.

WACASSA RIVER: Look between SR 24 and US 98 along the river bottom for large Pleistocene fossils.

WITHLACOOCHEE RIVER: Between SR 44 and SR 200, the fossils from the Miocene and Pleistocene era can be found.

ECONFINA CREEK: In northwest Florida from SR 20 to SR 388, Chipola shells and fossils can be found along the sandy bottom. The clarity of the water is excellent and be sure to check the springs area.

For five (\$5) dollars, you can obtain a permit to gather fossils. Write to the "Program of Vertebrate Paleontology, Florida State Museum, University of Florida, Gainesville, FL 32611". The permit protects you from being hassled by state officials.
