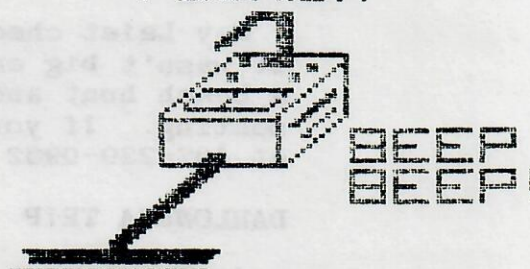

CIVIL WAR SALT WORKS SITES:

During the conflict between the states; salt was in great demand for food preservation. The Confederates built several salt works along the Florida coast and distilling the sea water to remove the salt. Several sites were destroyed by Federals but they were usually back in commission within a day or so. Perhaps relics may be found at these sites.

Salt works were located on Depot Key(?), Point Washington near Orange Hill, East River, near Suwannee River and Rocky Point on Tampa Bay.

Jenkins Creek near Bayport was a blockade runner port. The key at the north side of the West Pass near mouth of the Suwannee River was used to store captured cotton by Federal troops.

TH'ing Sites:

The island east of Horseshoe Island in Lake Harris once held a casino and bordello during the 1920's. The building is gone but the seawall remains. Its overgrown but hutable. One resident remembers gangster hoods patrolled seawall with machineguns. Accessible by boat only, launch from Lane Park. Possible cache site maybe hidden on island.
