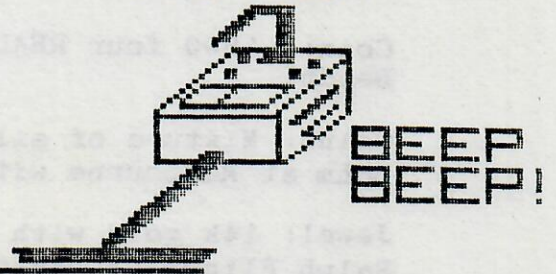

Lake: Fruitland Park - Holy Trinity Church; Mt. Dora - Gilbert house.

Volusia: Daytona Bch - Seabreeze United Church; New Smyrna Bch - Riverview Hotel; DeBary - DeBary Hall.
