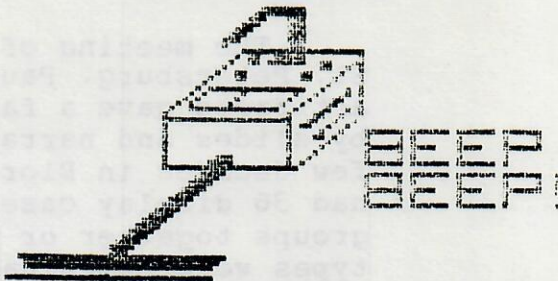

...SEPTEMBER AND OCTOBER NEWSNOTES...

The meeting of September 14, 1990 featured a speaker from St. Petersburg. Paul Lien, an collector of Indian and American artifacts gave a fascinating account of his travels illustrated by slides and narration of sites he has covered over the past few decades in Florida, Georgia, and other states. Mr. Lien had 36 display cases containing mostly arrowheads arranged in groups together or with Spanish relics. The color, size, and types were coordinated with the tribes which made them and used them for warfare, utility or for ornamental usage. Of the slides featured most he focused on the travels and life of Theodore De Bry who lived among the Indians for 5 years and captured accounts in artistic etchings of South Florida tribes around the time of the Spanish occupation of Florida. Time did not permit more extensive lecture but club members were given a short course in archaeology that was entertaining and informative for all.

Find of the Month: Barbara Phillips walked away with 5 winners this time! Her finds at the Camp Wildwood weekend hunt totalled about 70 items! Not bad at all.
