

Moving day

The house, listed on the National Register of Historic Places, was moved from a block away as part of a restoration project.

The above captioned photograph and subject first caught your editor's eye a month ago in an issue of the <u>Leesburg</u> Commercial. It has recently been featured as late as September 5, 1990 on page D-5 of <u>The Orlando Sentinel</u> in an article titled Kids bone up for archaeology.

On September 10 armed with a \$4,000 state grant and the aid of Archaeologist Dan Penton, of the University of West Florida in Pensacola some 60 Oak Park Middle School students and their teachers will dig in an artifact hunt for "Victorian garbage."

The center of all this attention- the 98-year-old Mote-Morris House will be in the limelight for two weeks while amateurs and professionals in a supervised archaelogical dig vie for "treasure."

The city of Leesburg, Florida in Lake County has until the first of October to restore the site which is a block away from the new site which is anticipated to be a historical museum in a unique restoration project.

DOWN THE LINE - - FT. BROOKE REVISITED

"Rolling research" is an essential part of metal detecting.

Jack and I do daily rolling research looking for potential sites
to hunt. Our favorite sites are vacant or scraped lots in older
parts of Tampa.

Recently during our rolling research the bulldozers were scraping a block long area for a parking lot which was in the Ft.Brooke area. This particular lot had been heavily searched and screened off and on for some years but it is always worth another try.

Ft. Brooke was located in downtown Tampa. The area has been heavily searched first by archaeologists and, when they were finished, by metal detectorists, bottle diggers and those who enjoy screening. Many people are constantly on the lookout for any renovation of this area in the hopes of locating another relic from the past. The fort was in operation from 1828 through the 1850's. Whenever sidewalks or roads are repaired, buildings torn down - anything where the surface will be removed - searchers are there. Sometimes we are rewarded with a few musket balls or buttons and other times we find nothing.

A light drizzle settled in as we started searching. A driveway to the parking lot was the first area to be searched as it had been unaccessable prior to this time. I found a musket ball as my first target, which was a good start. Jack found a broken Eagle hat plate, corroded and in several pieces, but recognizable and a nice find. After hunting for an hour the rain increased to the point where we had to stop detecting. Our finds for our short stay were one musket ball, four buck or pistol shots, three small assorted suspender buckles, Jack's Eagle hat plate and also he had a one-piece Artillary button.

We returned the next night and found out this would be our last chance to hunt this area before it was closed to hunting and screening. We were only able to get in approximately 45 minutes of hunting but it was enjoyable and somewhat productive. By the time we left I had 8 musket balls (one with initials carved into it), assorted shell cartridges, an interesting mini ball section, a two-piece General Staff button plus several miscellaneous items. Jack found 3 musket balls, assorted cartridges, another one-piece Artillary button, 2 pistol shots and some miscellaneous items.

Nothing outstanding from this site was found but several nice items nonetheless. It is always nice to be able to hunt any fort site area and finding something of interest is always satisfying.

The August 10th meeting provided club members and guests with a variety of informative interesting news and entertainment.

•A 25-minute color documentary by Frank Carter and Associates titled "In Search of the Civil War" was shown. Stills and staged skirmishes of the last days of the Civil War in the Shenandoah Valley near Richmond, Virginia were revealed in film that was a historical foray firmly rooted in the present.

Digs and notable finds were under bridges, in meadows and in dense forests. Some of the finds included U.S. Calvary insignia and musket balls, blades, button, and bits of buckle. The film was noteworthy since the battlefields for the most part lie under Federal protection and are part of the Manassas Battlefields that was established some 25+ years ago as Federal Park lands.
