June Meeting Newsnotes.....

Rob Loucks got \$25.50 for his winning share of the $\frac{1}{2}$ & $\frac{1}{2}$ draw. Our meeting spot was the Winter Park Memorial Chapel June 15. Due to a snafu by the booking agent for the Civic Center we met at the last minute at the Chapel located on 4150 Forsyth just south of Aloma and a 5 minute drive away. We had 41 members present and approximately 6 guests several of which joined our club. Our dues paying membership now stands at 89 members.


