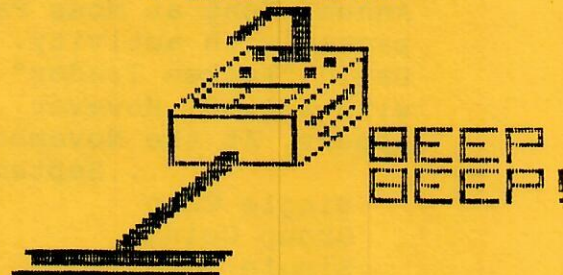

To mention a handsome gold crucifix about $1\frac{1}{2}$ "X 3" X $\frac{1}{4}$ " found by Charlie Petersen; Bill Ackerman's mind-blowing artifacts from the French-Indian War (weighty and impressive in appearance); a 10Kt. 1987 Class Ring found by Lorine Raw which was returned to it's owner, a local Winter Park man the next day; a Indian River Steamboat Company "243" local token by Edna Liberatore; and some fantastic jewelry found by Brent Petherick. The jewelry found by Brent included a ring found at Lithia Springs Park which was 14kt and decorated by a $\frac{1}{5}$ th carat (approximate) diamond. Some of the other jewelry found was at Pass-A-Grille Beach in St. Petersburg, and included a non-running 14kt Ladies Seiko Watch, a 10Kt VG Gold Men's Nugget Ring, a 10kt VG Gold Toothpick and Case!
