Single Coin: A Walking Liberty ca. 1940's was found by Barbara Phillips in Gaston Park on Tampa Bay. Group Coins: Alden Mitchell started his monopoly on the this month's finds with a 1943 Half Dollar, 1895 Quarter, 1917 Quarter, 1960 Quarter, 1915 Dime, 16 Mercury Dimes, 12 Roosevelt Dimes, 1 Canadian Thistle Token (1832), 1 Canadian Silver Dime, 3 Buffaloes, 2 Silver War Nickels, 2 "V" Nickels dated 1897 and 1906, 1 Indian Head Cent, 1 25 Bermuda Coin and Penny, 1 Australian Shilling, and an English Half-Penny. Single Jewelry: Charlie Petersen Group Jewelry: Alden Mitchell won this with a 22kt. Bracelet, a Gold Ring, a Gold-Plated Chain Bracelet, 1 matched Sterling Earrings, 4 single Sterling Earrings, 4 odd Earrings, 2 Arrow Pendants- one with a small 1935 Nickel on it, 4 Cheap Rings, 1 Large Odd Ring, 1 Gold-Plated Set of Earrings, 2 Odd Medals, and 1 Multi-Colored Bracelet. Florida Ghost Towns:

The Orlando Sentinel had a half page article on the same published on Thursday, November 12, 1992 on page I-3. The article written by Patricia Caporale of the Sentinel talks of a score of Florida Ghost Towns such as Eldora (once near New Smyrna Beach) and the town of Hawkinsville also known as Crowsbluff, located on the St. Johns River in Lake County, one mile south of the intersection of Highways 42 and 44. Reference is made to the 1985 book "Ghost Towns in Florida" by Jim Warnke which alludes to more than 300 in Florida that no longer exist. The article is featured with a picture of what remains of Eldora, a State House which was used as a vacation retreat. Funds are needed to refurbish it and turn it into an exhibit area by the Canaveral National Seashore, its current landlord. Check this article out and the book too for some cold winter night reading- it will make you anxious to vary your routine with the detector! Remember to go in a group or twosome, and follow the precautions necessary with venturing onto private and public lands. Get permission and be prepared for situations that may or may not be to your liking as the hobby is becoming more restricted. For info. on this call Bill Ackerman re his petition for Congressmen on the beefing up the ARCA Act of 1979 which restricts the hobby of metal detecting to include private lands!
