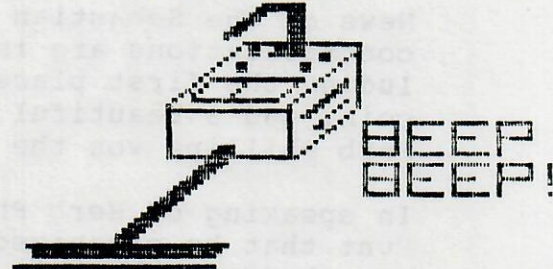

You may have found a KEY that will unlock a TREASURE CHEST OF OLD SILVER COINS.

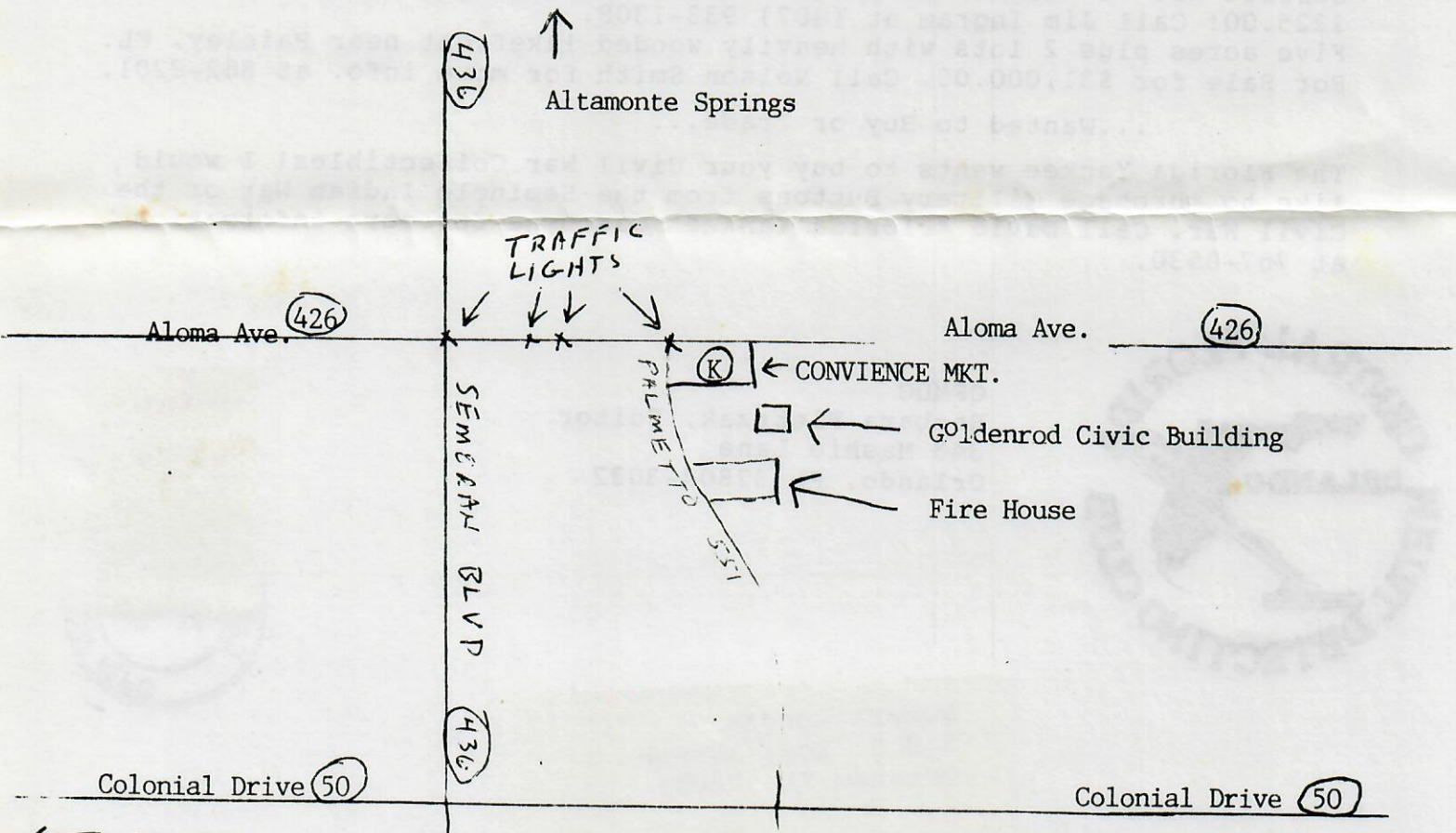
Return this bottle, with the KEY and this paper, to any meeting of the central flA. METAL DETECTING CLUB and see if it will open our TREASURE CHEST.
