

Stick, 2 rocks are directional aids

No matter how poor your sense of direction, you can quickly orient yourself outdoors on a sunny day. All you need is a long stick and two rocks or small pieces of wood. Find an open space and drive a 3- to 4-foot stick into the ground. Mark the end of the stick's shadow with the rock or wood chunk. Wait 15 minutes or longer and place the other marker at the spot where the shadow now ends. A line drawn between the two markers will be oriented in an east-west direction, with the first marker you placed being the western end. Find the shortest distance between that line and the stick, marking it with another line, that will point north.
