A bill is in legislation that will, if read wrong, give unlimited power to the Forest Service to control any natural feature of the United States. The bill will make it illegal to buy, sell, trade, dig, disturb and so forth any item they feel falls under the guidelines of the bill. The only exception noted was if the item has a "value" of less than \$25.00. The bill I've been talking about is 36CFR. We need to let our local congressman know we want this bill KILLED.

Here's some even more disturbing news...We have heard reports from other clubs up north of a government official going to club meetings and confiscating displays. It looks like we are going to have to give guests the third degree, or at least get them to identify themselves as soon as the get to the meeting. This shouldn't be to hard. We just need to give all guests a personnel warm welcome.
