

A COINSHOOTERS DREAM by BILL ACKERMAN

The dream of every coinshooter, a site so hot that every signal produces a coin or jewelry. Until that April of 1981, I had only dreamed of, or read about such hotspots in the various treasure maagazines. I found my dream site, in a city swimming pool and recreation area, about a half mile from my home in Winter Park, Florida.

While returning home from a day of coinshooting, I noticed a City Park crew painting and cleaning up the pool and recreation area in preparation for the summer swim season. I asked the supervisor for permission to hunt the grounds around the pool. To my surprise, he said yes, providing I would leave no unsightly holes, dispose of all trash items found, and hunt only when his men were present. After demonstrating how I use a probe to locate and pop out the coins, he gave me his final blessing. Because it was late in the afternoon, I was able to spend only about thirty-five minutes detecting. In that short time, I found 56 coins and obtained some valuable information.

The pool and grounds had been constructed as a private swim club in 1962, and contained half an acre of grass area, a volleyball court and a concession stand. I also learned that the swim club had allowed private clubs and groups to hold outing on the pool grounds.

I went home that afternoon, very excited at the thought of twenty years of people loosing coins and jewelry in the grass around the pool. Needless to say, I was on the site bright and early the next day. After an hour of detecting, I could hardly believe what I was finding. The ground was literally saturated with coins, most of them less than two inches below the surface. After seven hours of hunting, I had found 597 coins and five silver rings. All this from an area about 25 feet long and 15 feet wide. Following is a breakdown of finds after ten days hunting the pool grounds:

Half dollars: 3 2 Silver 1 Clad Quarters: 164 16 Silver 148 Clad Nickels: 287 5 Silver 282 Regular Dimes: 427 94 Silver 333 Clad

Pennies: 3635

Total Coins: 4516 117 Silver 764 Clad

Total Rings: 14 5 Gold 9 Silver

After those ten days I began to notice that I was finding fewer and fewer targets to dig. I began to think, that maybe I had just about hunted out the site. After some serious thought, I decided there had to be a lot more coins and rings on that site, and perhaps my old detector was not reaching them. I purchased a more powerful detector and returned to the pool grounds. I soon found, that I still had a very hot site.

I have returned to that site many times, and to date I have found a grand total of 10,327 coins and 26 rings.

Included in this total are, a 1864 two cent piece, 573 silver coins, 26 rings(10 Gold and 16 Silver). All in all, that site has been a coinshooters dream come true. I could not help thinking, that the old adage, a site is never cleaned out, certainly is true, and if every Th'er would join a club and follow the Th'ers Creed, there will be more dream sites for many years to come.

1995 dues are \$15.00 per person. Please mail them in or bring them to the meeting. While we're on the subject of dues we could use more members, if you know anyone interested in the hobby see if you can get them to come to a meeting. Just maybe they'll join.
