We watched two videos donated by Kellyco. One was an bottle hunting and the other was about the Goat Doctor caches.


Half and half was won for the second straight time by Lorine Raw. \$14.50. Bank Night went unclaimed as #35. Harry Rainey: missed \$30.00.
