Gene Hitchew won a silver dollar in the raffle. #26, Lonna Leist won \$20.00 for the bank night drawing.


Lonna and Madeline presented Mike Myers with a baby shower basket for their TH'er of the future. Thanks to everyone who brought in baby stuff for the basket.
