Secretary's Report For June's Meeting

The June meeting of the Central Florida Metal Detecting Club was called to order at 7:40 p.m. by president Ray Leist. The Pledge of Allegiance was let by Bill Shackelford. Ray noted that this month's meeting was being held on Flag Day. Brevard County

Emporia— North of Deland on SR 17. Cross over SR 40. Site is west of 17 and Lakes-in- Hills

Indian Springs— The springs were first used by the Indians. Located northwest of Samsula.
