Aurantia----- Located North of Turnbull on US 1 state road 5 about 5 miles then west on county road about 3 miles

City Point— Located just south of Sharpes on county road off US 1 state road 5

Flagler County

Dinner Island— People gathered for picnics. From Post Office go north west on SR 13 to Espanola. Find the old brick road north to an old county road going west to Dinner Island

Lake County

Conat--- Railroad sign at the siding located north west of Lady Lake take US 441 and 27 to SR .0 25 then north to Griffin Av then west to site

Emeralda ---- An island on upper end of Lake Griffin at top of Emeraldal Island

Pittman-- Froze out in 1888 North of Altoona on SR19

Orange County

Apopka Army Base-- eg/ Edwards Army Base-- Located east of the city park near the ball field. It covered several acres

Dog Island-- Located off shore in Lake Maitland and was used for public swimming and water skiing.

Fort McNeil-- A stockade used during the Seminole War. Located on SR 532 about 1200 feet north of the Taylor Creek Bridge.

Lake Barton Beach-- Located on north shore behind Fl. Highway Patrol Station.

Seminole County

Upsala---- Now a ghost town was located west of Sanford. Had a church, community building, school and cemetery. Cemetery still remains beside Upsala Rd.

Volusia County

Debary Creek Steamboat Wrecks--- Two Steamboat wrecks may be seen here at low water marks. The wrecks are between Mullet Lake and Lake Monroe.
