Website Of The Month

This month, let's look at one of the most popular forums for metal detectorists on the web. Forums are a meeting place for detectorists from around the world to ask for advice, share ideas, and sometimes, argue the fine points of our hobby.

One of the best known is <u>www.treasurenet.com</u>. This forum is free to join, though Charter Members who pay a small annual fee (about \$20.00) get extra benefits, such as an enhanced search option. This website recently underwent an upgrade and is more graphic intensive than the previous version.

One of its obvious strong points are the pictures and videos of finds posted by the forum members. Some of them are a good source of inspiration.

Treasure In The News!

In February, the AJ Hackett Bungy crew stuck gold without even trying. Gabe Reid and James Marshall were working in the Kawaru River in New Zealand when they spotted what they described as "a sparkle in the water". What they pulled out was a gold nugget. The alluvial gold registered at 1.44 kg, making it second largest nugget ever found in New Zealand (the first was a 3 kg nugget found in 1909).

The nugget was put on display, but not being satisfied with that, they made a fateful decision. To celebrate the find, they performed a bungy jump with the stone in Reid's hands. After being dunked in the river with the nugget, Reid came back up empty handed. He had dropped the gold.

Reid has since declined to comment publicly. They are sending in divers to look for the nugget, but given the swift current of the Kawaru River, the chances of it being found are slim. (*From the Otego Daily Times*, 02/04/2012)


