More Gold Facts!

One ounce of gold can be stretched over fifty miles.

75% all of the gold currently in use has been extracted since 1910.

The largest nugget ever found was in Australia in 1869. It was 10x25 inches and yielded 2,248 ounces of pure gold. FYI: in was found just 2 inches under the ground.

In March 2008, gold topped \$1,000 per ounce for the first time in history.

Starting in 2009, the mint date for all Sacagawea dollars have appeared on the edge of the coin, instead of the obverse or reverse as is traditional with most coins.
