Because of his death, the Central Florida Metal Detecting Club was asked by the Kissimmee Police department to organize an evidence search where this crime occurred. Today, July 6th, 37 individuals gave their Saturday morning to aid in the search for the bullet which ended a life.

Volunteers drove from as far away as Cocoa, Palm Coast, Apopka, Orange City, and Titusville. Thirty members of the CFMDC club were joined by seven members of the TCAS club and we searched for approximately 5 hours to help bring some closure to this case.

As a result of our search efforts, the Kissimmee Police now have fresh new evidence that they would otherwise never have been able to recover. Within the next few days, ballistic testing on the recovered evidence may well be the break needed to help the police bring this case to a successful end and take another creep off the streets for good!

Everyone that participated in this search effort should be proud. The time and effort spent today is also part of what makes our country great. Just think about it.... Today you did your part.

On July 20th, 2013, we will hold the fifth annual Ray Leist night hunt at Sunsplash Park in Daytona. This is one you won't want to miss. We'll have additional details at the meeting.

Remember, we have started a brand new category for the finds table. This category is for "new members only" during their first year.
