CRISIS UNIT

With 988 launching this summer, we are no longer part of the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline network. We answered Lifeline calls for 17 years, from 2005 - 2022. We've always been a proud Lifeline supporter and will continue to promote this important resource in the UP.

Our Safety Net Program continues to offer follow-up assistance to people seeking counseling or other professional care options. We reach out by phone call or text to help people stay safe during this process. You can find eligibility requirements and our online enrollment form at www.dialhelp.org/programs.

MENTAL HEALTH

Our counseling staff have been hard at work making updates to expand our counseling program. This includes building upgrades and new scheduling software.

After a hiatus during COVID-19, we will once again be offering Substance Use Disorder (SUD) outpatient counseling services.

In-person and telehealth options will be available. We look forward to taking clients this fall.

PREVENTION

Houghton/Keweenaw Communities That Care (CTC) is gearing up for their sixth annual suicide prevention walk! This year will feature both a walk and community picnic, with food vendors, resources, a free raffle, and more. The event will be held on September 10 from 11am - 3pm at Kestner Waterfront Park. VICTIM SERVICES

Our second annual Puppy Parade for Sexual Assault Awareness Month in April was a success! We had 100 people attend with their pups, where they learned about sexual assault, resources for help, and how to support survivors.
