CHEYENNE BIBLE TRAINING CENTER STATEMENT OF FAITH

The Scriptures

The Bible is the inspired Word of God, the product of holy men of old who spoke and wrote as they were moved by the Holy Spirit. The New Covenant, as recorded in the New Testament, we accept as our infallible guide in matters pertaining to conduct and doctrine. (II Timothy 2:13, II Peter 1:21)

The Godhead

Our God is one, manifested in three persons - the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit being co-equal (Philippians 2:6). God the Father is greater than all; the Sender of the Word (Logos) and the Begetter (John 14:28, John 16:28 and John 1:14). The Son is the Word, flesh-covered, the One Begotten and has existed with the Father from the beginning (John 1:14, John 1:18 and John 1:1). The Holy Spirit proceeded forth from both the Father and the Son and is eternal (John 15:26).

Man, His Fall, and Redemption

Man is a created being, made in the likeness and image of God. Through Adam's transgression and fall, sin came into the world. "...all have sinned and come short of the glory of God ..." "As it is written, there is none righteous, no, not one." Jesus Christ, the Son of God, was manifested to undo the work of the devil. He gave His life and shed His blood to redeem and restore man back to God (Romans 5:12, Romans 3:10 and I John 3:8). Salvation is the gift of God to man. Separate from works and the law and is made operative by grace through faith in Jesus Christ, producing works acceptable to God (Ephesians 2:8).

Eternal Life and the New Birth

Man's first step toward salvation is godly sorrow that worketh repentance. The New Birth is necessary to all men and when experienced produces eternal life (II Corinthians 7:10, John 3:3-5 and I John 5:12).

Water Baptism

Baptism in water by immersion is a direct commandment of our Lord. It is for believers only. The ordinance is a symbol of the Christian's identification with Christ in His death, burial and resurrection. (Matthew 28:19, Romans 6:4, Colossians 2:12 and Acts 8:36-39).

Baptism in the Holy Ghost

Baptism in the Holy Ghost and fire is a gift from God as promised by the Lord Jesus Christ to all believers, in this dispensation and is received subsequent to the New Birth through Jesus Christ. Baptism in the Holy Ghost is accompanied by the initial evidence of speaking in other tongues as the Holy Spirit gives utterance (Matthew 3:11, John 14:16-17, Acts 1:8 Acts 2:38, Acts 19:1-7 and Acts 2:4).

Sanctification

The Bible teaches that without Holiness no man can see the Lord. We believe in the Doctrine of Sanctification as a definite, yet progressive work of grace, commencing at the time of regeneration and continuing until the consummation of salvation at Christ's return (Hebrews 12:14, I Thessalonians 5:23, II Peter 3:18, Philippians 3:12-14 and I Corinthians 1:30).

Divine Healing

Healing is for the physical ills of the human body. Healing is wrought by the power of God through the prayer of faith and by the laying on of hands. Healing is provided by the atonement of Christ. Healing is the privilege of every member of the Body of Christ today. (James 5:14-15, Mark 16:18, Isaiah 53:4-5, Matthew 8:17 and I Peter 2:24)

Resurrection of the Just & the Return of our Lord

The angels said to the disciples of Jesus, "... this same Jesus, which is taken up from you into Heaven, shall so come in like manner as ye have seen Him go into heaven". His coming is imminent. When He comes, "...the dead in Christ shall rise first: Then we which are alive and remain shall be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air...." (Acts 1:11, I Thessalonians 4:16-17). Following the Tribulation, He shall return to earth as King of kings and Lord of lords together with His saints who shall be kings and priests and shall reign a thousand years (Revelation 20:6).

Hell and Eternal Retribution

The one who physically dies in his sin without accepting Christ is hopelessly and eternally lost in the Lake of Fire and therefore has no further opportunity of hearing the Gospel or repenting. The Lake of Fire is literal. The terms "eternal" and "everlasting" used in describing the duration of the punishment of the damned in the Lake of Fire, carry the same thought and meaning of endless existence as used in denoting the duration of joy and ecstasy of the saints in the Presence of God (Hebrews 9:27 and Revelation 19:20).

TUITION

There is a one-time application fee of \$25.00 to be paid at the time of submitting your application. All tuition must be paid before first class unless other arrangements have been made.

For the **Associate's Classes** per semester the tuition is as follows:

Married Students (husband & wife both attending):

Prior Graduates of CBTC	\$60.00

Students may apply to begin the Associate's program at the beginning of any semester but must complete all 10 semesters in order to graduate and receive their diploma.

For the **Bachelor's Classes** tuition is \$150.00 per semester for members and non-members alike. Students will need to complete the Associate's program and 6 semesters of the Bachelor's program to graduate with a Bachelor's degree.

Activity Fee - \$50. This will cover your cap & gown, diploma, and additional activities that will be planned throughout the year.

Application fee, activity fee, tuition and books can all be paid via cash, check or credit card.

Textbooks

Each class textbook cost will depend on current book costs. Bachelor's class books are included in the tuition fee.

Grades

Grades will be based on any combination of attendance, pop quizzes, homework, reading the textbooks, research papers and tests. The combinations will be determined by each instructor.

Scholarships

We do have some scholarships available. Funds will be made available on a case-by-case basis. Please see the Dean for more information.

CLASSROOM COURTESIES

Attendance

Bible College is a commitment. It requires acting responsibly by being diligent to faithfully attend each class. Roll call will be taken in each class weekly. Excused and unexcused absences will be determined by the administrator.

Attendance on exam nights is of the utmost importance. Students that do not attend on exam nights will have 5-10 points (instructor's discretion) taken off their total scores. For extenuating circumstances please contact the Dean.

Class Schedule

Associate's Classes are held on Tuesday evening promptly starting at 6:30 P.M. and ending by 9:00 P.M.

Bachelor's Classes are held on Tuesday evening promptly starting at 6:00 P.M. and ending by 9:00 P.M.

Out of respect for other students and instructors being on time is a necessity. If an emergency arises that requires you to be absent, please call or text the Academic Dean.

All students are expected to be involved in Sunday morning worship, at the church of their choice, as part of their college training.

Dress Code

Cheyenne Bible Training Center students should dress in a manner that is becoming and displaying good Christian character. In class and out of class you are a representative of Jesus and of CBTC.

Classroom Courtesies

Be courteous to those around you. Conversations during the teaching will distract others causing them and you to not hear what is being taught.

Time is at a premium. Please return to class from break time promptly.

Cell phones **MUST** be turned off or on vibrate. You will have a short time between breaks to return calls. Be considerate of your classmates. Let family and friends know you are in class. Ask them to refrain from calling during class time unless it is an absolute emergency.

Tablets or laptops may be used for note taking, Bible apps and study aids.

Children are not permitted to attend classes. This is a time you need to commit to set apart for yourself to receive from God as you are learning and growing in the revelation and understanding of the Word of God.

Wi-Fi

Wi-Fi is available. Please see the Dean for the password. Wi-Fi is limited to 10 users on a first come, first serve basis.

Gifts of the Holy Spirit

Taught by Pastor David Kibben

This study in pneumatology defines the 9 supernatural gifts of the Holy Spirit listed in 1 Cor 12:8-10. The course also covers scriptural examples of these gifts, and it examines the operation, purpose, and benefits of the gifts in the church today.

BACHELOR CLASSES

Semester #1

Biblical Apologetics

The word apologetics means an argument or defense in the justification of something. This course will present you with amazing pictures, thorough research to support the validity of the Bible and Christian beliefs.

Basic Theology

An in-depth look at the terms and ideas every student of the Word should know about theology. You will be presented with dozens of references, resources, terminology and Bible passages that confirm our beliefs in the Scriptures.

Unsealing the Daniel Cipher

This course delves into the incredibly complex and nuanced prophecies in Daniel, highlighting specifically, the parallels between prophecy in Daniel and Revelation.

Semester #2

Canonization of Scripture

How did we arrive at the collection of 66 books of the Bible that we now have and consider canon? Can we trust that those books belong legitimately among all the others? What does it mean for Scripture to be inspired? All of this and more will be explored in this course.

Equipping the Church for Revival

This course discusses the leadership structure and theological foundations of the church as well as revival and outreach.

Festivals of Israel (first half)

This course focuses on the 7 feasts of Israel and their prophetic interpretation from a Hebraic perspective.

Semester #3

Festivals of Israel (second half)

This course focuses on the 7 feasts of Israel and their prophetic interpretation from a Hebraic perspective.

Theology of the Holy Spirit

The Holy Spirit appears in various ways throughout the Bible. This course delves deeply into all of those depictions and gives a theological account of what they all mean.

In the Beginning...

In this course we will explore the Creation account through the Hebraic language and philosophy. This will go beyond surface-level to give context and meaning to one of the most foundational stories of the Christian worldview.

Semester #4

Demonology & The Authority of the Believer

Where do demons come from? What does the Bible say about their existence? This course goes through Hebrew and Greek word studies on evil and a theological expose on the role of the devil in the Old and New Testaments but focuses on the final authority of the Bible.

The Tabernacle (first half)

This study breaks down the ancient Israelite Tabernacle and how the objects within it carry theological, symbolic and moral implications that be applied to today's Christian life.

Decoding Bible Mysteries

The Word of God is a living book filled with prophecies, encoded information about the origin of everything and is filled with scientific facts. This class will help you connect the dots!

Hearing the Voice of God

There are 2 primary aspects to communicating with God: knowing how to speak to Him and knowing how to hear from Him. This class will focus on hearing from God.

Semester #5

The Mashiach

This course explores Jewish history, culture and writings to give an account of the Hebraic view of the Messiah and how Christians can reconcile that with their belief in Christ.

The Tabernacle (second half)

This study breaks down the ancient Israelite Tabernacle and how the objects within it carry theological, symbolic and moral implications that be applied to today's Christian life.

Theology of the Trinity

The theology of the Trinity is one of the greatest mysteries of the Christian faith. This course will examine history and church tradition to help give a better sense of this fundamental doctrine.

Semester #6

Hebraic Roots – Customs & Traditions

This course is a fascinating study of Hebrew customs and traditions from a Messianic perspective.

Hebrew 101

The Hebrew language is one of the oldest surviving languages known today and it's the official language of Israel. It was the language most of the Bible was originally written in. By studying Hebrew, a Bible reader can absorb Scripture like the best biblical scholars and break down any modern translational discrepancies for themselves.

Types & Shadows

This study takes a focused look at the patterns of Bible prophecy and the types and shadows that have yet to unfold.

Sins of stealing, lying, gossiping, backbiting, cursing, drunkenness, sexual immorality, occult activities, bad attitudes, jealousy, bitterness, etc. must be avoided.

As a student of CBTC I commit to the following:

- To strive for excellence.
- To submit to the authority of the Scriptures in matters of faith and Christ-like attitudes and conduct.
- To allowing the Holy Spirit to lead and guide.
- To avoid even questionable situations.
- To cooperate with those in authority.
- To respect the interdenominational character of CBTC by refraining from spreading potentially divisive doctrines.
- To refrain from behavior that would be a discredit to the Lord Jesus Christ and to CBTC.

As a student of CBTC I understand the standards given in the Word of God, the Bible, are my guide for my behavior whether I am in class or in another location. I understand I am a witness watched by others of the Lord Jesus and as such I will behave in such a way as to consistently bring Him glory.
