Patterson/Cunningham and Blake/Clevenger Teams Claim Inaugural Kickoff Best Ball

Mother Nature cooperated nicely with sunny skies, mid-sixties temperature and no frost delays—not exactly bad conditions for late April in Mid-Michigan. Tournament Director Scott King was very pleased with the turnout of nineteen teams in the Open Division and another four in the Senior Division in GLAGA's inaugural Kickoff Best Ball.

The four-ball stroke play event was contested at Hawk Hollow Golf Course on April 27, 2004. Smith Patterson and Rush Cunningham carded six birdies, off-set by a lone bogie, to post a five under par round of 67, easily outpacing the field in the Open Division. The teams of Alex Coss/Karl Bohnoff and Brian Pauli/Tony Keim finished joint second with rounds of 70.

Jerry Blake and Ron Clevenger won the Senior Division with an even par round of 72. Jim Rapp and Howard Clevenger finished one shot out with a costly finishing bogie, when a par would have forced a sudden-death playoff.

The Champions received crystal pilsner glasses, gift certificates for Hawk Hollow merchandise and certificates from The Garland Resort, GLAGA's 2004 Event Sponsor.

Jonathan Pauli Captures Spring Stroke Play; Jerry Blake Wins Again in Seniors Division

Cool, damp conditions greeted a full field of competitors at GLAGA's Spring Stroke Play Tournament held at The Emerald at Maple Creek on May 1 and 2, 2004. St. Johns' Jonathan Pauli avenged last year's suddendeath loss to Tony Keim with a two-day total of 146 (73,73) for a two stroke victory over first day leader Russ Cunningham and Josh Orler who posted 148 totals over the challenging course.

Jerry Blake closed with an impressive 73 for a 150 total, which bettered Larry Wuetrich by three strokes in the Seniors Division. Stu White rallied with a final day 74 to claim third place.

Matt Friend lead the First Flight with a 36-hole total of 152 (79,73), which was five stokes better than a trio of players, Paul Hughes, Charlie Green and Karl Bohnhoff. In the Second Flight, Brian Pauli (Jonathan's elder brother) won the first hole in sudden death over Doug Hankey. Both players finished with 164 totals. Tim Russell claimed third place with a total score of 165.

Winners of each Open Division Flight and the Senior Division received GLAGA Championship crystal pilsner glasses. GLAGA awarded merchandise gift certificates to top finishers





BY THE RULES

The USGA and the R&A jointly established sweeping changes to the rules of golf, which took effect January 1, 2004. For a complete list of the changes, (which affected rules, decisions, definitions, equipment specifications, appendices, and the rules of amateur status) visit www.usga.org. Click on Rules of Golf and print the press release.

I would like to cover seven changes that I feel may most likely pop up during your next G.L.A.G.A. tournament, your member/guest, or that hot money match with your evil brother-in-law.

- 1. Removal of loose impediments on the line of putt. In the past, this could only be done with the players hand or clubhead. Now, any means is allowed, provided that the player does not test the surface, alter the line of putt, or unduly delay play.
- 2. Before 1-1-2004, if you moved a loose impediment within a club length of your ball, through the green, and the ball subsequently moved, you incurred a one stroke penalty and the ball had to be replaced. This is no longer a penalty UNLESS your action causes the ball to move.
- 3. The committee now has the authority to disqualify a player for a serious breach of etiquette.
- 4. There is now a definition for a tee. A "tee" is a device designed to raise the ball off the ground. It must not be longer than 4 inches and it must not be designed in such a way that it could

indicate the line of play or influence the movement of the ball. Penalty for use of a non-conforming tee is disqualification. Note that if you elect to use a tee, it must be placed in or on the surface of the teeing ground. You are not permitted to place your tee in or on an irregularity of surface, a pile of dirt or sand, or anything else raised above the surface of the teeing ground.

- 5. The non-cash value of a prize for an amateur has been raised from \$500.00 to \$750.00.
- 6. If a player invokes rule 3-3 (electing to play a second ball in stroke play due to doubt as to procedure), the player must report the facts of the situation to the committee before turning in his scorecard. Failure to do so results in disqualification.
- 7. The definition of a "lost ball" has been changed in part b of the definitions section. Previously, a ball was lost if the player had *dropped* a substituted ball. Now, under part b, the original ball is not deemed lost until the player has made a *stroke* at a substituted ball.

So, for 2004 the good news is: the rule book has been amended for clarity. The bad news is: the rule book, at times, still lacks clarity. If you have a question regarding the rules of golf, please feel free to e-mail me, Terry Kildea, at tlkildea@aol.com. There is a good chance that I won't know the answer, but I will know where to get it for you.

Play well, have fun, and take time to stop and smell the flowers along the way.


