The Diabetes, Heart Disease, Kidney Disease Triangle

Did you know that diabetes can lead to other health conditions heart disease and chronic kidney disease? About 1 in 3 adults with diabetes also has chronic kidney disease, and about 6 in 10 adults with diabetes also have high blood pressure.

Diabetes can cause sugars to build up in the blood stream, which damages arteries and blood vessels over time. This damage can show up in many places, including your heart and kidneys. But here's the good news...because these conditions are connected, the life style changes you make to manage diabetes will also help to prevent or manage those other chronic conditions (and vice versal).

I was advised that gift cards are a favorite donation. Those can be to Kroger or Walmart or to restaurants local to the area. To locate nearby restaurants, use Goggle search. Gas cards are also suggested. She also recommended crafts and art supplies for the children.

I also talked to a friend whose daughter is often treated in Washington DC and one of her favorites has been stuffed animals, but the lady at WVU said they cannot accept them because they cannot be sanitized. Apparently different hospitals have different guidelines.

We have several clubs that donate lap quilts. I would urge all clubs to take on a project designed to help children with cancer. I remain available to provide programs at your meetings.

Recently my home club helped another organization fill bags with snacks that children at one school can take home so they might have food over weekends or in the evening. These bags were filled with food that children can fix for themselves. It took less than an hour to fill 270 bags. There are other volunteers who pack these bags as well, demonstrating that different organizations can join together to meet the needs in their communities. Some other ideas might be to stage a food drive and donate items to a food bank.




