Message from DG Jay Houser

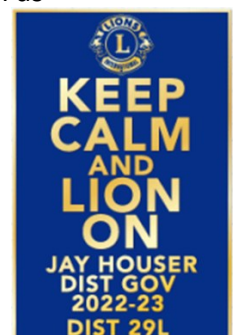


HAPPY GROUNDHOG DAY

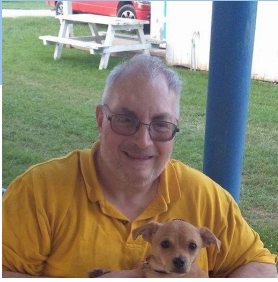

The application must be received by the district governor by February 16, 2023. Applications can be sent by email. The district governor will then forward all applications to the Nominating Committee for eligibility verification. All applicants will then be notified of their eligibility. Offices to be elected are district governor, second vice district governor, and Sight Foundation trustee. There is no application for trustee. District elections will be held at the convention. Each club should select delegates who are members in good standing. Your club will receive a letter with your delegate allotment.

DELEGATES MUST REGISTER at the credentials desk upon arrival at the convention to receive a certified credential. A certified credential will be required to vote. Alternates will not be necessary.

Every client who comes to the campus of Leader Dogs for the Blind for training is asked a simple question – How was your experience? Without fail, clients excitedly mention the tasty food and excellent service provided by our kitchen staff. Many add, "I was amazed at the effort they undertook to meet my dietary requirements."

"As far back as 40 years ago, we provided a special menu for our clients who were diabetic," shares Sharon Dougherty, manager of residential and food services. "Today we support a wide variety of diets to meet individual religious or health requirements." Our kitchen team accommodates a large variety of diets including diabetic, Kosher, Halal, gluten free and lactose free, often providing several in addition to a standard menu in each class.

But our kitchen staff don't stop there, they include fun activities centered around meals. There is fiesta night with mocktails (alcohol free drinks) like margaritas, and Michigan-centric products like apple cider and donuts (a Fall treat), barbecue dinners and ice cream drinks made with locally produced orange and ginger sodas.

Because LDB has been serving clients from Spain for several decades, some of their wonderful cultural traditions have influenced our menus, most notably the importance of including fresh fruit with every meal. We've been lucky that some clients have shared their treasured family recipes with us, allowing us to prepare traditional Spanish cuisine for the entire class to enjoy.

Public transportation to and from a client's home to the Leader Dog campus and accommodations and meals while training is also provided free of charge.

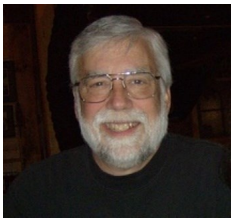

I need your help identifying prospective host families with whom you have personal knowledge and with whom you would feel comfortable having your son or daughter stay with for 4 weeks. There must be a two-parent household with one of the parents available at home with the student. Please consider hosting a student but if you can't please talk to your families, friends, co-workers, church families. Talk with teachers. They are excellent hosts. Don't be afraid to encounter an experience that will forever enrich your life.

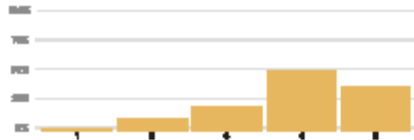

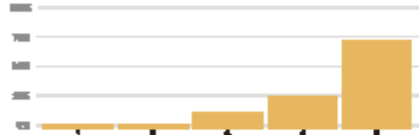

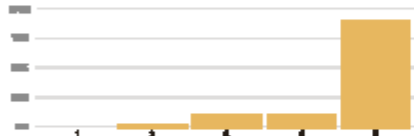
