Message from DG Jay Houser



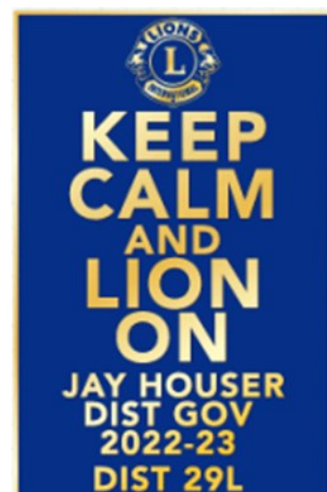
Convention Time

Happy March Lions of 29L!!!

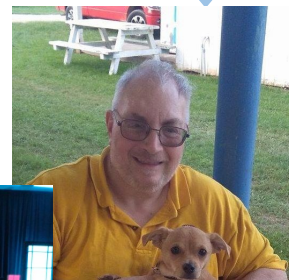

Club leaders should be working on the following:

1. Incoming Club Officers – nominating committee; elections according to C&BL; reporting to LCI (PU101) and District (incoming District Governor and Cabinet Secretary/Treasurer).
2. The new LCI portal is expected to be up and running around July 15th – it is IMPERATIVE that club secretaries review any changes in member addresses, and especially email addresses – and make those changes on the current site so LCI will have the most current information for our membership.
3. Encourage member attendance at the District Convention scheduled for March 18 in Vienna, WV. District elections will be held at that time – we need your participation please!!

If anyone is interested in becoming a Guiding Lion (for either new clubs or clubs that are being rejuvenated) – you can take the certification program online self study through LCI Learning Center or I am tentatively scheduling a certified Guiding Lion Zoom workshop for either late April or May – this will be a 2 hour course. Either way, there is a certification test which must be taken. New Guiding Lions are to be approved by both the District Leadership Chair and the current District Governor. Anyone interested in a Zoom training for Guiding Lion certification must contact me no later than April 10, 2023 at bpit@comcast.net.

I have not set up Officer Training dates yet, but am planning on Zoom training to be done late May into June for incoming officers. It is important that your new officers be reported to LCI as quickly as possible, I will need their email addresses to send links to them.

10 Surprising Things That Can Spike Your Blood Sugar

When you first found out you had diabetes, you tested your blood sugar levels often. Doing so helped you understand how food, activity, stress, and illness could affect your blood sugar to zoom up. You try to adjust with food or activity or insulin, and its dips really low. Knowledge is power!

Look out for these surprising triggers that can send your blood sugar soaring:

Sunburn – the pain causes stress, and stress blood sugar levels to sore.

Artificial sweeteners-more research is needed, but some studies show they can raise blood sugar.

Coffee-even without sweetener. Some people's blood sugar is extra sensitive to caffeine.

Losing sleep – even just one night of little sleep can make your body use insulin less well.

Skipping breakfast-going without that morning meal can increase blood sugar after both lunch and dinner.

In compliance with Article VI, Section 2 of the Standard Form District By-Laws, I hereby issue the Official Call for the 2023 District 29-L Elections. The District 29-L Elections will be held Saturday, March 18, 2023 at the District 29-L Convention. Balloting will be done in person only. The purpose of the elections is to elect a District Governor, Second Vice District Governor, Trustees to the West Virginia Lions Sight Conservation Foundation and other elected positions, if required. DELEGATES MUST REGISTER at the credentials desk upon arrival at the convention to receive a certified credential. A certified credential will be required to vote. Alternates will not be necessary.

Section 3. (Lions Clubs International Constitution and By-Laws) CLUB DELEGATE FORMULA.

Each chartered club in good standing in the association and its district (single, sub- and multiple) shall be entitled in each annual convention of its district (single, sub- and multiple) to one (1) delegate and one (1) alternate for each ten (10) members who have been enrolled for at least one year and a day in the club, or major fraction thereof, of said club as shown by the records of the international office of the first day of the month last preceding that month during which the convention is held, PROVIDED, however, that each such club shall be entitled to at least one (1) delegate and one (1) alternate; and FURTHER PROVIDED, that each district (single, sub- and multiple) may, by express provision in its respective constitution and by-laws, grant full delegate status to each past district governor who is a member of a club in such district independent of the club delegate quotas hereinabove specified. Each certified delegate present in person shall be entitled to cast one (1) vote of his/her choice for each office to be filled by, and one (1) vote of his/her choice on each question submitted to, the respective convention. The major fraction referred to in this Section shall be five (5) or more members. Any club which is newly chartered, and any other chartered club which takes in new members prior to the convening of any such convention, shall have its delegate quota determined on the basis of members who have been enrolled in the club for at least one year and a day as shown on such record date in the records of the international office. Delinquent dues may be paid and good standing acquired up to fifteen (15) days prior to the close of credential certification, as such closing time shall be established by the rules of the respective convention.
