3) Goals

Zone Award Criteria

- □ Confirm each club has at least three viable, meaningful service projects planned for the year.
- □ Promote the Club Excellence Award and the tools available to support strong clubs.
- □ Encourage every club to actively recruit members.
- □ Visit a regular meeting of each club and report findings and suggestions to the district governor.
- □ Host three District Governor Advisory Committee Meetings (zone meetings).
- □ Promote attendance to district (sub-and multiple) and the International Convention.
- □ Promote Leadership Development courses on the LCI website to all club members.
- □ Meet with your successor to share the status of the zone and plans for future action.
- **D** Complete either the Zone Chairperson Training or the Certified Guiding Lion Training.
- □ Host a successful Zone Meeting. Attached a copy of the agenda and minutes.
- □ Ensure that all clubs are in active status and each club properly elected and reported their club officers.
- □ A minimum of 25% of the clubs qualified for the Club Excellence Award. The award application can be downloaded from the Club Excellence Award <u>webpage</u>. The criteria are summarized below:

Club Excellence Award Criteria

- □ Achieved a net growth of one or more members or chartered a new Lions club or Club branch.
- □ Contributed to LCIF an amount equal to or greater than the club's membership total multiplied by US5.
- □ Started a new service project.
- □ Listed three service activities your club participated in that were reported to LCI.
- □ Club is in Good Standing: Not in Status Quo or Financial Suspension. District dues paid and no unpaid balance with LCI greater than US\$50 outstanding 90 days or more.
- □ Reported club officers to LCI.
- □ Key officers participated in club officer training.
- □ The club has publicized its service activities through local media or social media.
