 - a. On Monday, March 18, 2019, detectives were able to develop information of the whereabouts of Mitch Mullins. Mullins was wanted for the felonious assault of his wife as a result of an incident in Celina on January 18, 2019 as well as an escape charge filed by the Ohio Adult Parole Authority.

Celina Detective Steve Yoder located a suspect vehicle north of Celina in which Mullins was a passenger. Detective Yoder kept the van under surveillance, following

it for several miles awaiting for sufficient back up to arrive. Mullins is known to be violent and was suspected to be armed.

Mitch Mullins fled from the van in the area of Southworth Rd. just south of Landeck Rd. in Allen County. Officers from Celina P.D., Delphos P.D., Spencerville P.D along with Deputies from Allen, Auglaize and Mercer County Sheriff's Offices were on scene as well as the Grand Lake Drug Task Force. A perimeter was established then a K-9 Deputy with Allen Co. Sheriff's Office performed a track of the area and located Mitch Mullins hiding in a brush pile about 100 yards from Southworth Rd. He was taken into custody without incident.

Wastewater
