Join Us for the 2024 Fremont Area Big Give!

The Bridge is one of the many nonprofits participating in the 2024 Fremont Area Big Give, a 24-hour online giving event organized by the Fremont Area Community Foundation to celebrate the power of philanthropy and support the good work of nonprofits who help make the Fremont area a special place to live, work and thrive.

In years past, we have seen a substantial increase in support for our mission through this event. In 2023, we successfully raised \$10,510 from 61 gracious donors, which was matched by a generous anonymous donor. Including the \$1,565 won in prizes, we raised a total of \$22,585! This was the second highest amount raised of all the non-profit organizations that participated.

We are beyond grateful for our past donors and can't wait to connect with new and past donors during this year's event. Thanks to every donation received our work to eliminate and prevent domestic violence and sexual assault continues.
