Mistakes you can avoid:

- 1. Failing to hire a professional is a big mistake-An Enrolled Agent is knowledgeable in the tax code and has been tested-in the tax code- in order to be an 'EA'.
- 2. Not keeping track of your spending or receipts.
- 3. Not taking advantage of retirement accounts. Daisy has some unique suggestions.
- 4. Ignoring your holding periods when investing.
- 5. Failing to offset gains with losses. (More on that in Wash Sales).
- 6. Not taking tax credits available to you.
- 7. Not using a Flexible Spending Account (FSA) or a Health Savings Account (HAS)....author's note: provided these are available to you at your job.
- 8. Not taking (if you are of an age where you should take) RMDs from your IRAs.
- 9. Increasing your odds of being audited. Soon to posted: Messy and thoughtless actions in a return which pretty much guarantee that you will be in the 'sights' on audit time.
