Episcopal Church Women

The cabinet being built to hold all the music for both Trinity Choir and Alleluia Choir was completely funded by a Rose Grant given by the Episcopal Diocese of Idaho. Therefore, ECW will not need to help with funding that project. It was decided that we would pay half of the cost for electrical upgrades on the church. Our pledge for that project is \$1,000 of the \$2,000 bid.
