## From Rev. Haydie

Happy fall, all!

It really **is** fall, now. We've seen the first golden trees, the first chilly mornings, the first snow on the hilltops. Yes, we'll go back and forth among several different seasons before fall is officially "over," but that's life in Idaho—and it's a blessing. St. Francis reminds us of that in his "Canticle of the Sun":

Praised be You, my Lord, through Brother Wind,

sustenance to Your creatures.

We often talk about the wonders of creation in the spring, when everything around us is bursting with new life. I hope we share Francis' love for the world God created; I hope we share, too, some of his humility and faith. How blessed we are in all the abundance that surrounds us.

## Miffy's Message

I find the church calendar fascinating because it is replete with celebrations. It documents all the principal feasts of the church year like Easter, Trinity Sunday, and All Saints. These are marked by special celebrations, and often a change in the color of the paraments. There are also numerous Feasts of our Lord such as the Holy Name, the Presentation, and the Transfiguration. Other major feasts include all feasts of Apostles, all feasts of Evangelists, and individuals like St. Stephen, Mary the Virgin, Mary Magdalene, St. Michael, All Angels, etc.

*The Book of Common Prayer* provides prayers for the major feasts as well as the Common of Saints, which are prayers for lesser saints such as martyrs, missionaries, pastors, theologians, teachers, and monastics. There is also an entire book of *Lesser Feasts and Fasts* which includes prayers for those days. We could pray and celebrate almost every day of the year! October has 17 special days. The oldest to be celebrated is Ignatius of Antioch, Bishop and Martyr, c. 115. The latest to be added by the church was John Raleigh Mott, Ecumenist and Missionary, 1955.

**Now for the truth.** My favorite saint is St. Francis of Assisi, Friar and Deacon, 1226. One of my favorite prayers is the Prayer of St. Francis whether it is spoken or sung. His feast day is October 4<sup>th</sup>, so we are celebrating this Sunday, October 8<sup>th</sup>. He is well-known for his many miracles involving animals and birds, also for his compassion for healing critically ill and injured people. He is the patron saint of ecology, including animals. His most famous quote is "Start by doing what's necessary; then do what's possible; and suddenly are you doing the impossible."

**Your job is to bring pictures of all your animal buddies to church on October 8<sup>th</sup>. You are also encouraged to bring a bag of dry cat or dog food to the church in the month of October to help our Buddhist friends with their food drive.** As the prayer says, "Lord, make me an instrument of your peace."

**We'll celebrate St. Francis on Sunday, October 8, with**

- A Eucharist liturgy from *A New Zealand Prayerbook*.
- Pictures or drawings of your beloved pets—bring those pictures with you!
- Takeaway bags of treats for your cat or dog.
- A dry pet food drive supporting Pocatello's Homeless Stand Down (see next page).

# Pet Food Drive for Homeless Stand Down

Taking place on Saturday, October 29, Southeast Idaho's annual Homeless Stand Down offers supplies and services to the homeless and those at risk of becoming homeless. One real need for many is pet food. So Pocatello's Buddhist community, the Portneuf Sangha, is collecting dry pet food (mostly dog, some cat) for this event, and Trinity wants to help. What better way, after all, than to honor the Feast of St. Francis? To contribute, bring a bag of dry pet food either to our St. Francis service on October 8 or to the church office through October 28. Volunteers at Portneuf Sangha will break larger bags down into smaller quantities for distribution.

# Episcopal Church Women

Episcopal Church Women (ECW) met September 16<sup>th</sup> in the parish hall. Kathleen Kangas reported on the plan and needs for the college mid-term bags sponsored by Trinity. All orders need to be completed by October 6. Baked goods need to be packed in sandwich bags with one or two treats per bag and brought to the church by Sunday, October 8. We will fill the bags during coffee hour and load them to be delivered on Monday, October 9<sup>th</sup>. Volunteers are welcome.

We agreed to fund the remainder of the cost of the cabinet being built to hold all the music for both Trinity Choir and Alleluia Choir. We hope that much of the funding will come from a Rose Grant given by the Diocese and private donations. ECW will pay the remainder of the bill.

Rev. Diane reported that PWCC is planning a Christmas Angel Tree. We agreed to be a sponsor and help with postage. Anyone who wishes to participate will be given a child for whom to buy presents. The gifts are for an inmate to give to her children or grandchildren for Christmas. More details are forthcoming.

Parish Life Committee (Monica Eckert) agreed to hold an autumn pot luck the end of October or first of November. Watch for details later in October.

Our annual Trinity Christmas Fair will be held December 10 and 17 with gift options being available on the 10<sup>th</sup> and cookie plates added on December 17<sup>th</sup>. ECW will meet on December 16<sup>th</sup> to make cookie plates for the sale. This is a fundraiser that gives us money to help with church ministries as needed.

The next meeting of ECW will be October 21<sup>st</sup> at 11:00 in the parish hall. All women age 16 and up are members and welcome to attend.

**And yes: it's that time of year again.** Trinity's stewardship season will begin on October 22, so watch for your stewardship letter in the mail as that date gets closer! We'll be collecting and blessing pledge cards at our Sunday Eucharist service on November 26.
