I love this time of year! Maybe it's because I spent my whole career in schools that began in the autumn. Every year, September feels like a new beginning. Since we are starting anew, Trinity needs more people to do the jobs that are so very Episcopalian. We need more:

- Ushers (greet, bulletin at back table, count attendees, take up bread/wine, collect offering)
- Lectors (read a lesson at the mic during the service)
- Intercessors (read responses from the pews during Prayers of the People)
- Altar Guild members (set up/clean up everything needed during the service)
- Brass polishers (brass candlesticks, etc.)
- Flower arrangers (purchase and arrange flowers). There is a flower fund.
- Helpers at My Brothers' Table (set tables, help serve, make take-home bags, clean up)
- Helpers with Midterm Care Packages (advertising, baking homemade treats, assembling bags, and/or delivery.)
- Volunteers for PWCC (must attend a workshop at the prison first)
- Coffee Hour hosts (set up/clean up, make coffee, provide food for after the service)
- Audiovisual team members (stream the live service).

If you would like to know more about any of these jobs or just want to volunteer, please talk to Rev. Haydie or me. The more participants we gain, the fewer turns any one person has to take to keep the church and outreach going. Trinity needs your time and talent as well as your treasure!
