PNTC-March 12,2022 Business Meeting

Meeting held at the Masonic lodge in West Seattle. Conrad Berthold started the meeting at 10:00 am. Tom Brown has resigned in his position as club treasurer. Conrad has taken on the mantle of interim treasurer. He has resigned from his duties as WA VP and Board appointed President post. He can only hold one office at a time. Once the new Board is established, if the position of President is not filled, then one of the board members will be appointed to that position for one year. Conrad has put his name down to fill the position of Treasurer. Conrad announced the list of current officers and volunteers. John Thornberg is our computer operator and has asked if someone would be willing to occupy that position for the Seattle meetings.

Budget Review: The 2022 budget was prepared by Tom Brown and is up for a review and must be voted on by the club membership in order to be enacted. Any costs that are above and beyond what's listed in the budget will be voted on by the membership of the club. Steve Crow made a motion to pass the budget as written. Bill Racine seconded the motion and it was unanimously passed by the membership with a show of hands. This was also voted on and approved in Oregon last month.

Scholarship Review; Annamarie Schmidt-David Kingston passed away recently. The PNTC scholarship fund is a beneficiary in David's will. He has bequeathed the club \$10,000,00. The rules of the estate say that nobody gets their disbursement until after David's wife Violet is done being taken care of so that she isn't shorted financially at the end of her life.

Scholarship flyers are available here today to grab & hand out to high schools in your area.

We are required by law to give out scholarships equal to 30% of the money that we as a club spend in a year. This year, because of BITW, we may be required to give out 3 or 4 scholarships depending on how much BITW costs us-combined with our normal expenses.

Scholarships are \$2500 each. One half is paid during the Fall term, and the remainder is paid during the winter term. The scholarship is paid directly to the college not the student. The scholarships are for a 2 year or less education at a trade school or an unpaid apprenticeship program.

Announcements: Eugene Johnson recently passed away , and Ken McKim passed away in December. Conrad will evaluate his collection of tools and plan for one or two future auctions.

Old Business: BITW 2022; Aug 26-28. Still need volunteers. Registration forms available online and on the table. We have 18-20 registrations so far.
